1.	Applications for the examination must be submitted online only, as no printed application form is available.
2.	Candidates must ensure that they fill in the authentic application form accessible exclusively at www.wbjeeb.in . Submission of duplicate applications is strictly prohibited.
3.	Do not attempt to make any duplicate application.
4.	Candidates must provide a valid mobile number and a unique, active email ID , as all future communication from the Board will be sent to these registered contacts. The Board will not be responsible for non-receipt of communication arising from incorrect, inactive, changed, or non-functional mobile numbers or email IDs, or due to network issues.
5.	Once the registration details— name, father’s name, mother’s name, domicile, and date of birth —are entered and submitted, they cannot be changed under any circumstances . These details must exactly match the corresponding information in official documents such as school/college admit cards, mark sheets, certificates, identity proofs, and caste/category/income certificates (as applicable). These documents will be required during entry to the examination hall, counselling/admission, and University registration.
6.	Do not share your application number, password, or security question and answer with anyone. The Board will not be responsible for any adverse consequences arising from such actions.

1.0	<p>Introduction:</p> <p>The West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board (WBJEEB) was established in 1962 by the Government of West Bengal, in exercise of the powers conferred under Article 162 of the Constitution of India pursuant to the G.O. No. 828-Edn(T) dated 02.03.1962.</p> <p>Subsequently, the Government of West Bengal enacted the West Bengal Act XIV of 2014, thereby reconstituting the West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board and entrusting it with the authority to conduct Common Entrance Examinations for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate professional, vocational, and general degree courses in the State. The Act further empowers the Board to undertake online and/or single-window counselling for such admissions.</p> <p>Since 2012, WBJEEB has been playing a pivotal role in conducting admission processes entrusted to it, which are based on online application systems and allocation through e-Counselling. The Board remains committed to ensuring fairness, transparency, accuracy, and the adoption of advanced technological practices in all its operations.</p>
2.0	<p>The Examination: WBJEEB will conduct the OMR-based Common Entrance Test, JEMAS (PG)-2025, on the basis of the request from the WBUHS. The examination is intended to offer admission to the Medical & Allied Sciences Postgraduate courses at various colleges/institutes throughout the State of West Bengal. The various courses and eligibility criteria, including academic qualifications, have been framed by WBUHS.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Date of Examination: 5th July 2026</p>

	<p>a) Questions are to be answered on a specially designed optical machine-readable response (OMR) sheet, which will be evaluated by the Optical Mark Recognition method. Thus, it is very important to follow the correct method of marking.</p> <p>b) Candidates will indicate their response to the questions by darkening the appropriate circle completely with a blue/black ink ballpoint pen.</p> <p>c) Any other kind of marking, e.g., filling the bubble incompletely, filling with pencil, cross mark, tick mark, dot mark, circular mark, overwriting, scratching, erasing, white ink, marking outside the bubble, etc., may lead to wrong/partial/ambiguous reading of the response. WBJEEB will be in no way responsible for such an eventuality, which may lead to cancellation of the OMR sheet.</p> <p>d) Response marking cannot be edited/changed/erased/modified.</p>
2.7	<p>Ranking Methodology and Merit Lists</p> <p>a) WBJEEB will prepare merit ranks based on the candidates' scores in the Common Entrance Test. Individual candidates will be able to view and download his/her Rank Card, which will contain their score and rank. WBJEEB does not publish any rank or score lists to ensure the confidentiality of each candidate.</p> <p>b) The rank shall be in the name and style of 'GMR' (General Merit Rank).</p> <p>c) Ranking shall be done in descending order of total marks scored. In the event of a tie, the tie-breaking rules set out in Section 2.7 shall apply.</p> <p>d) Separate reserved category merit position will also be indicated for respective category of students, e.g., SC Rank, ST Rank, EWS Rank, PWD Rank, etc., as applicable.</p> <p>e) Sequencing order for counselling/allotment of seat/admission will be based on GMR only (not on category ranks). 	a) A printed copy of the admit card.
	b) A copy of a colour photograph was uploaded during the online application.
	c) Any photo identity card in original, such as Aadhaar card/ PAN card / Passport/ voter card/ 10th standard admit card/ School ID card.
6)	Candidates are not allowed to carry any written or printed material, calculator, pen, log table, wristwatch, any communication device like mobile phones, any Bluetooth device, etc. inside the examination hall. Any candidate found with such prohibited items/objects/articles will be reported against, and his/her candidature will be summarily cancelled.
