1. INTRODUCTION

Rehabilitation for Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) is related to a range of measures from interventions to improve body function for social inclusion and integration. As per Article 26, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD) defines rehabilitation as "appropriate measures, including through peer support, to enable persons with disabilities to attain and maintain their maximum independence, full physical, mental, social and vocational ability, and full inclusion and participation in all aspects of life". According to the Census 2011, it is estimated that in India, 2.21 % of the total population, around 2.68 crores, have one or another form of disability. The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all, including Persons with special abilities. In recent years, there have been significant and positive changes in society's perception of persons with disabilities. It has been realized that a majority of differently abled individuals can lead a better quality of life if they have equal opportunities and effective access to rehabilitation measures. The services of Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Prosthetic & Orthotic, Communication therapy/Speech-Language Therapy, and Audiological intervention professionals, along with other medical & paramedical professionals, are essential at different stages to prevent, manage disability, and support rehabilitation.

1.1 Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act 2016

Since the 1970s, efforts by the Government, NGOs, and civil society for persons with disabilities have intensified, beginning with the concept of "Rights for Disabled Persons." The UN led this charge by issuing the 1975 declaration and declaring 1983-1992 as the "Decade of Disabled Persons," which extended to the "Asia and Pacific Decade" (1993-2002). In 1993, the UN General Assembly adopted standard rules for equalization of opportunities. India's "Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act" was enacted in 1995, defining government responsibilities and mandating affirmative action while emphasizing prevention, medical services, and rehabilitation through education and vocational training. The significant Rights of Persons with

Disabilities (RPwD) Bill was enacted on December 28, 2016, expanding the categories of disabilities from 7 to 21 and emphasizing rights to equality, property, and accessibility. The following are the disability conditions included in the RPwD Act 2016.

The new Act of RPwD 2016 requires barrier-free access within two years and holds private sectors accountable, including recognized educational institutions. It also increases job reservations for persons with disabilities from 3% to 4%. Moreover, the Government of India has established several National Institutes, including **Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya National Institute for Persons with Physical Disabilities (Divyangjan) (PDUNIPPD)** for training professionals in rehabilitation.

1.2 Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya National Institute for Persons with Physical Disabilities (Divyangjan), (PDUNIPPD)

PDUNIPPD is an autonomous organization under the administrative and financial control of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DIVYANGJAN), Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India. Originally, the Institute for the Physically Handicapped was registered as a society in the year 1976 under the Societies Registration Act of 1860. It was rechristened as Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya National Institute for Persons with Physical Disabilities (Divyangjan), PDUNIPPD, New Delhi, in 2016.

PDUNIPPD is located in the heart of New Delhi, the capital city of India. It is committed to developing skilled manpower to serve Persons with Disabilities (PwD) by offering Bachelor programs in Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Prosthetic & Orthotics and Master programs in Physiotherapy, Prosthetic & Orthotics.

1.3 Department of Physiotherapy

Physiotherapy is a healthcare profession dedicated to the comprehensive assessment, investigation, treatment, and guidance of individuals experiencing movement or functional difficulties. Practitioners establish functional diagnoses and design individualized treatment plans to address dysfunction, disability, pain, and healing needs arising from trauma or disease.

The institutional department of physiotherapy provides comprehensive outpatient rehabilitation services to patients with various disabilities and also contributes to the development of manpower in the field of Physiotherapy. The department is equipped with highly sophisticated therapeutic modalities for the management of patients with various functional limitations, impairments and disabilities resulting from injury, disorders and diseases. More than 150 patients visit the department daily with musculoskeletal, neurological, cardiovascular and sports injuries of all age groups for maximizing, improving, and restoring their motor functional limitations and motor movements. The physical therapists operate as independent first contact practitioners, as well as members of health service teams. Patients and clients can avail direct physiotherapy services without referral from another healthcare professional.

Opportunities for higher education and research exist across specialties such as musculoskeletal science, neuroscience, cardiopulmonary science, sports science, pediatrics and neonatology, obstetrics and gynecology, oncology, and community physiotherapy. Physiotherapists work in diverse settings, including hospitals, private clinics, nursing homes, occupational health centres, outpatient clinics, home-based care, sports and fitness facilities, special schools, senior citizen centres, and community rehabilitation or disaster relief programs.

2. MPT SPECIALITIES OFFERED UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOTHERAPY

2.1 Duration of MPT Course: Two (02) Years (Annual Mode)

2.2 Affiliating University: University of Delhi

2.3 Eligibility for Admission (As per NCAHP Guidelines)

- a. Candidates must have passed the Bachelor of Physiotherapy (B.PT) on regular mode from a recognized university.
- b. The candidate must have completed 6 months of internship at the time of admission.
- c. Admission to the Master of Physiotherapy course shall be made based on eligibility and marks obtained in the CUET (PG) 2026 Entrance test. No candidate will be admitted on any ground unless he/she has appeared in the CUET (PG) 2026. Merit list/ Waiting list will be generated based on marks obtained in the CUET-2026 only.
- d. During subsequent counseling (s) the seat will be allotted as per the merit of the candidate, depending on the availability of seats on that particular day.
- e. Candidate has to furnish at the time of submission of the application form, a certificate of physical fitness from a registered medical practitioner as per NCAHP norms and two references from persons other than relatives testifying to satisfactory general character.
- f. A candidate who fails to attend the Medical Examination/ physical fitness as per NCAHP norms on the notified date(s) will forfeit the claim for admission.

Note:

1. Decimals equal to 0.5 or above have been rounded off to the next higher digit.
2. For the UR category, a maximum of 2.43 seats can be reserved in an academic year; considering 2 academic years, it comes to around 4.86. Hence, 2 seats are allotted for the current academic session, and 3 seats shall be allotted in the subsequent year.
3. For the EWS category, a maximum of 0.60 seats can be reserved in an academic year; considering 2 academic years, it comes to around 1.20. Hence, 1 seat is allotted for the current academic session, and no seat shall be allotted in the subsequent year.
4. For the OBC category, a maximum of 1.62 seats can be reserved in an academic year; considering 2 academic years, it comes to around 3.24. Hence, 2 seats are allotted for the current academic session, and 1 seat shall be allotted in the subsequent year.

5. For the ST category, a maximum of 0.45 seats can be reserved in an academic year; considering 2 academic years, it comes to around 0.90. Hence, no seat is allotted for the current academic session, and 1 seat shall be allotted in the subsequent year.
6. One (01) seat shall be reserved for PwBD (5% reservation of total intake strength, i.e. 18 seats) and shall be allocated to any one speciality as per the preference of the meritorious PwBD candidate.

2.5 Reservation Policy

2.5.1 Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) Candidates

- 15% of the total number of seats are reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste, and 7.5% of the total number of seats are reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribes.
- The caste certificate should clearly state:
 - a) name of caste/tribe
 - b) whether the candidate belongs to SC or ST
 - c) District and the State or Union Territory of the candidate's usual place of residence, and the appropriate Government of India Schedule under which the caste/tribe is approved as SC or ST.
- The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ST certificate:
 - a) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate/Sub-divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner
 - b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate
 - c) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar
 - d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/ or his family normally resides
 - e) Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands)
- Candidates should note that the SC/ST certificate from any other person/authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, the candidate's caste/tribe must be listed in the appropriate Government of India Schedule.

2.5.2 Reservation of Seats for Other Backwards Classes (OBC Non-Creamy Layer)

- 27% of seats are reserved for candidates belonging to Other Backwards Classes (OBC-Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).
- The OBC candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DoPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31st March 2016). The Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2026.

2.5.3 Reservation Policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

- Under the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the institute has reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates belonging to the EWS. The EWS certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2026.

2.5.4. Reservation Policy for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) (Divyangjan)

- A total of 5% seats in the MPT course are reserved for PwBD Candidates (with a benchmark disability of 40 % as per the RPwD Act).
- The candidates from the PwBD (Divyangjan) category are required to appear before a duly constituted medical board for examination to certify that the fitness of the candidate to pursue the course of study in light of his/her physical disability and the requirements of the courses as per the NCAHP (capable of carrying out all activities related to Theory /Practical work as applicable to the courses without special concession and exemption).
- A candidate who fails to attend the Medical Examination on the notified date(s) will forfeit the claim for admission and placement in the waiting list, except permitted by the competent authority under special circumstances. The decision of the Board shall be final.

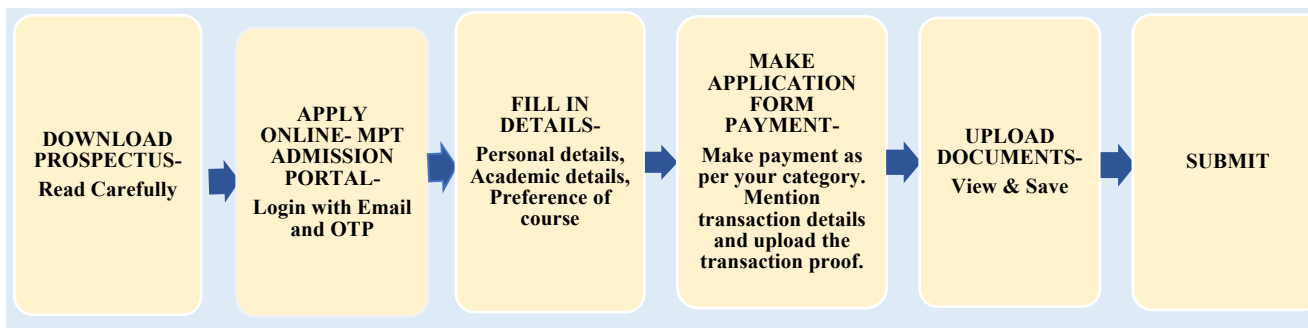
3. ADMISSION PROCESS

3.1 Important Points to Consider:

- I. For the academic year 2026-27, admission to the Master in Physiotherapy (MPT) will be done only for candidates who have appeared in the Common University Entrance Test- Postgraduate 2026 (CUET (PG) – 2026).
- II. All candidates desirous of taking admission at PDUNIPPD should apply only through the online portal at the Institute website <https://pdunippd.nic.in>. Admissions taken and granted through the official online platform of the MPT Admission portal 2026 will only be considered valid.
- III. Before initiating the application process, the candidate must refer to the Information Brochure for MPT Program-Specific Eligibility Criteria, list of streams available, seat matrix, fee structure, checklist, and other relevant information published.

- IV. Application submitted through any other mode other than the MPT admission portal 2026 will not be accepted under any circumstances.
- V. The Institute will not be responsible for a candidate's lack of awareness of the admission guidelines, eligibility criteria, checklist, schedule of activities for MPT admission 2026, and any other notices uploaded on the Institute's website, and the admission online rules. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to check the email and the admission website regularly.
- VI. Admission to the MPT course will be made exclusively based on merit obtained in CUET (PG) – 2026. As per the order of merit list, candidates will be asked to report for the counselling at PDUNIPPD.
- VII. In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal scores in the CUET-2026, the inter- se-merit of candidates will be determined according to the following criteria: -
- The candidate getting a higher overall percentage in the Qualifying Degree (BPT) shall rank higher.
 - In case of a tie in the obtained CUET -2026 score and overall percentage in the Qualifying Degree (BPT), the candidate older in age shall rank higher.
 - Further, as the merit list will be generated based on the marks secured in the qualifying BPT Degree examination and date of birth (in case of a tie) as provided by the candidate during submission of the application form, the candidate will lose the right for admission if the information provided is found to be incorrect during document verification.
- VIII. **The course fee for the first year must be paid in full for admission on the day(s) of physical counselling via digital banking/ online mode. Partial submission of the course fee will not be accepted.**

3.2 Online Application Form-MPT Admission Portal-2026



3.2.1 Apply Online

The candidate shall have to apply online through the Institute website, <https://pdunippd.nic.in>. The candidate's email ID shall be the user ID and log in through OTP sent to the candidate's email ID.

3.2.2 4-Step Process of Online Application Form:

Step 1: Fill in the application form.

Step 2: Upload documents.

Step 3: Pay the registration fee & fill in the transaction details in the online form.

Step 4: Review the application form and submit.

The candidate will receive an acknowledgement with the application number on his/ her Email after successful completion and submission of the application form.

3.2.3 Instructions for filling-up the online application form:

- I. Registration fee Details for submission of Application Form are as follows:
 - Rs. 1000 (Rupees One Thousand Only) for General/OBC/EWS candidates
 - Rs. 700 (Rupees Seven Hundred Only) for SC/ST candidates.
 - Registration fee is exempted for PwBD candidates having UDID cards.
- II. The registration fee, once paid, is non-refundable in any circumstance.
- III. The candidates will have to provide their personal details. The details must match the particulars mentioned in the candidate's certificates/documents. Mismatches/ discrepancies may lead to the rejection of the Application Form at any stage.
- IV. The percentage obtained in the Qualifying Degree must be stated. If marks in the qualifying degree are in CGPA, the candidate must convert the CGPA to an equivalent percentage as per the CGPA conversion rules of the University from which the Qualifying Degree has been obtained. The percentage of marks must be entered to two decimal places. Rounding of percentages is not allowed.

- V. The candidate must take utmost care while giving the preferences of the stream (Master of Physiotherapy in Musculoskeletal Sciences, Master of Physiotherapy in Neuroscience, Master of Physiotherapy in Sports Sciences), as the order of preferences will determine the allocation of the seat.
- VI. Admission of a candidate is purely provisional and is subject to verification of original documents by the PG Admission Committee (MPT), PDUNIPPD. During physical verification, if any document/certificate is found inadequate/ insufficient/ inappropriate, it will lead to cancellation of the admission, ipso facto. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission to PG Program.

4. CHECKLIST OF DOCUMENTS TO BE PRODUCED AT THE TIME OF PHYSICAL VERIFICATION OF CERTIFICATE AND COUNSELLING/ ADMISSION

- 1) Print out of the application form for admission into MPT-2026.
- 2) Print-out of CUET-2026 Application Form.
- 3) CUET Score/ Rank card
- 4) Four (4 no.) colour passport-sized photographs of the Candidate (same as uploaded in the CUET (PG)-2026 application form).
- 5) Original Documents-
 - i. Proof of Date of Birth / Class X Certificate. The Date of Birth must match the CUET(PG)-2026 form.
 - ii. Certificates of degree/provisional degree certificate, all marksheets (yearly/ semester-wise) and internship completion certificate of the qualifying Degree examination. The name of the candidate in the marksheet must match the CUET(PG)-2026 form.
 - iii. SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD category certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD must match the name that appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(PG) - 2026. Similarly, his/her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates.
 - iv. OBC - Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC Central List issued by

<http://nbc.nic.in>. The Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2026.

- v. EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority certifying that the candidate can claim a reservation under this category. The EWS certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2026.
- vi. PwBD certificate/ UDID card should be in the name of the candidate, issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a photograph of the candidate (as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities).
- vii. Certificate of physical fitness from a registered medical practitioner
- viii. Two references from persons other than relatives testifying to satisfactory general character.
- ix. Migration certificate in original from the respective regular University where he/she has studied. (Exempted for students of the University of Delhi).
- x. Affidavit on prescribed format on a non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 10/- only in response to Raghvan's Committee recommendations endorsed by Hon'ble Supreme Court to Anti Ragging, duly filled in by the candidate and the parents/guardian.
- xi. If a candidate is employed in any organization, He / She should submit a valid "NO OBJECTION" certificate from the employer at the time of counselling.
- xii. Self-attested copy of the Aadhaar card, an undertaking form for fulfilling the minimum eligibility criteria and an undertaking form for not joining any other courses (Annexures attached).

5. FEE REFUND POLICY

University Grant Commission (UGC) had issued a notification on the fee refund policy for the first year of undergraduate and postgraduate students at the universities for the academic session 2024-2025 vide their letter No. D.O.No.F.2-71/2022(CPP-II) (C-114546) dated 12-06-2024. The above fee policy will remain in force for the subsequent academic sessions until the issuance of a revised policy by UGC. Fee refund at PDUNIPPD shall be as per the UGC notification and University of Delhi norms.

6. GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Violation will attract severe disciplinary action by the Institute and the initiation of cases under IPC and CrPC.
- 2) There is “No hostel availability for PG students”.
- 3) The candidates admitted will have to follow the rules framed from time to time and should maintain utmost discipline, decency and decorum in their behaviour with the staff, co-workers, and co-students.

7. ATTENDANCE

Students must attend classes regularly. Students will have to fulfil the criteria as per the University of Delhi and NCAHP norms.

8. DECLARATION BY THE CANDIDATES

If any information furnished by the candidate is found to be false later on, his/her admission will be forfeited without notice, and legal action deemed fit will be initiated against the student.

9. SCHEDULE OF ACTIVITIES FOR MPT ADMISSION-2026

Candidates are instructed to visit the Institute website <https://pdunippd.nic.in> in frequent intervals for the latest information related to MPT Admission- 2026, till completion of the Admission/Counselling process. No personal or other mode of communication, like hard copy communication, SMS, WhatsApp, or email, will be made individually. No Complaint related to this will be entertained.

Candidates interested in pursuing admission to the MPT program for the academic session 2026-2028 at PDUNIPPD (Divyangjan) should take note of this information to ensure an effective seat allotment and admission process.
