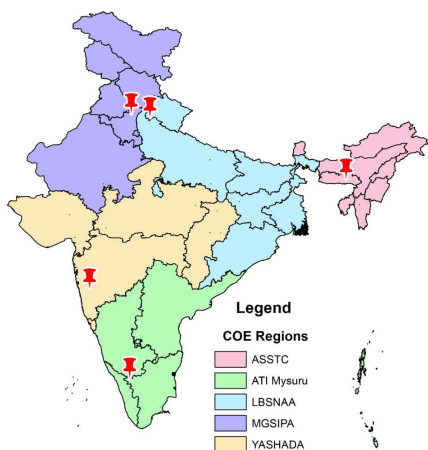

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Funding Pattern



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- CoE operational w.e.f. **01.10.2024** till 31st March, 2026. Extendable post assessment of the performance of the CoE
- The financial support under the CoE includes
 - (i) Remuneration to Experts, technical consultants and Support staff, and TA and DA
 - (ii) Equipment, Computers, Printers, Internet Facility etc.
 - (iii) Research Literature and Consumables
 - (iv) Organizing Workshops/Conferences/Seminars and Trainings in the relevant area
- Maximum admissible amount for 2024-25 (for 2 quarters i.e. 01.10.2024 to 31.03.2025) is Rs.46.00 lakh (including Rs.12.00 lakh as one time office establishment cost) and recurring expenditure for 2025-26 onwards would be Rs.68.00 lakh.

- hands-on training for **digitization and georeferencing** etc.

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3. Research & Documentation:

- Research on best practices and innovative solutions
- Journals, papers, articles on land related domain

4. Use of technology

- **survey /re-survey** activities using advanced technologies
- development of **new applications**, innovation and improvement of technology
- high end **technology support** in Land Surveying, Computerization of RoRs, Digitization of Cadastral Maps etc. for Urban and Rural area

5. Regulations (Revenue, Registration, Acquisitions etc.)

- RFCTLARR Act, 2013 and matters relating to acquisition of land
- Study various acts of State Government related to urban and rural land records and titling etc.

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6. Best Practices

- Standardization of parameters for Land Parcels envisaged in National Geospatial Policy 2022
- Foster relations across countries, between governments, academia, industry etc.
- Create network of institutes and resource person

7. Monitoring and Evaluation

- Monitoring & Evaluating the impact of land governance reforms and initiatives
