

#### PREFACE.

Under recent orders it has become the duty of a Settlement Officer to draft a new Edition of the District Gazetteer. The materials ready to hand when I took up the work were of a somewhat meagre character so far as the old Hissar District was concerned: consisting practically of the former Gazetteer only which was confessedly inadequate as such. The present work is therefore not a revised edition of a former work but for all practical purposes entirely new and deals with an area considerably greater than that with which the old Gazetteer dealt. At the same time the information contained in the old Gazetteer, so far as it was useful and correct up to date, has been embodied in the present work. The remaining information relating to the old Hissar District, that is to say the four Southern Tahsíls which have been recently under Settlement, has been for the most part collected by myself with the aid of Tahsildars and others since the beginning of January 1891 when I joined the District. Had more time been available I should have been able to satisfy myself more fully on several points connected with social customs and other matters which are still doubtful. But what has been done will no doubt serve as some basis for further enquiry.

For the information regarding the Sirsa Tahsíl (not under Settlement) I am almost entirely indebted to Mr. Wilson's encyclopædic Settlement Report of the Sirsa District.

The Statements appended give as a general rule the latest available information.
