Subject:- Allocation of food grains (Rice and Wheat) under Welfare Institutions to State Governments/UT Administrations during the current financial year 2012-13.

Sir.

In continuation of this Department's allocation orders of even number dated 9.4.2012 and 01.05.2012 on the above noted subject, I am directed to convey the approval of the Government of India for the monthly allocation of the following quantities of rice and wheat at BPL prices to States mentioned at Sl.No. 1 to 11 in colmn. 2 of the table below for the months of October, 2012 to March, 2013 and Sl. No. 12 & 13 in column 2 of the table below for the months of April, 2012 to March, 2013 under Welfare Institutions scheme respectively:-

The above allocation of food grains to State Governments of Chhattisgarh, Kerala and Manipur has been after adjustment of unspent balance of 1188.22 tons of rice, 303.30 tons of rice & 11.988 tons rice respectively available with these States as on 31.3.2012 under the scheme. No allocation of wheat has been made to Government of Kerala as State Government has unspent balance of 657.756 tons of wheat available with the State as on 31.03.2012 which is more than their requirement of wheat i.e. 382.02 tons of wheat for the 2nd half of 2012-13 under the scheme.

- The validity period for deposit of cost and lifting of food grains for the months of October, 2012 to December 2012 in respect of 11 States/UTs namely Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Manipur, Nagaland, Odisha and West Bengal for the months of October to December, 2012 and in respect of 2 States namely Assam and Maharashtra for the months of April, 2012 to December, 2012 will be up to 45 days and 50 days respectively from the date of issue of this letter and for the subsequent months of January, 2013 to March, 2013 will be as per instant instructions of the Government.
- FCI will release the food grains (rice & wheat) as mentioned against each State in the above table. The said 3. quantity of food grains will be released from the nearest godown / depot of FCI to States on prepayment of the cost of the food grains by the concerned State Government.
- FCI may give suitable instructions to their concerned Regional Offices, accordingly under intimation to this Department.

The onus for non-allocation of food grains on account of non-submission of UCs will rest entirely upon the concerned States Government.
