# Inter-ministerial Review Meeting by Hon'ble Minister Social Justice and Empowerment on 06.04.2023, 3:00PM, Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, New Delhi

The meeting was held under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Minister Social Justice & Empowerment along with Km. Pratima Bhoumik, Hon'ble Minister of State for Social Justice & Empowerment. The meeting was steered by Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) and was attended by representatives from 16 Ministries/Departments, excluding Department of Consumer Affairs, Ministry of Culture, Department of Telecommunication and Department of Law and Justice. The detailed list of participants is enclosed at **Annexure A**.

- Secretary DEPwD welcomed Hon'ble Minister Social Justice and Empowerment Dr. Virendra Kumar and Minister of State Km. Pratima Bhoumik. He further explained the context for the meeting, wherein he mentioned various issues/concerns/representations etc. raised by Persons with Disabilities across various sectors while appreciating the zealous efforts being in by put Ministries/Departments in formulation of sector-specific accessibility guidelines. During his opening remarks, Secretary, DEPwD emphasized on the importance of compliance audit of the implementation of the provisions of the sector specific guidelines by Ministries/Departments.
- 3. The meeting proceeded further by Shri. Rajeev Sharma, Joint Secretary, DEPwD with setting the key agenda of the meeting, highlighting the key provisions of RPwD Act 2016 regarding the time limit for accessibility by service providers in Section 46 which states that Time limit for accessibility by service providers.—The service providers whether Government or private shall provide services in accordance with the rules on accessibility formulated by the Central Government under section 40 within a period of two years from the date of notification of such rules: Provided that the Central Government in consultation with the Chief Commissioner may grant extension of time for providing certain category of services in accordance with the said rules.
- 4. In addition to this, Rule 15 of RPwD Rule 2017 which states that the standard of accessibility in respect of other services and facilities shall be specified by the Central Government within a period of six months from the date of notification of these rules.

- 5. Furthermore, a step by step flow of the process of notification of guidelines in e-gazette followed by notification in RPwD rules 2017 and demonstrating the achievements made under Accessible India Campaign by Ministries/Departments on a broader level, presented by Shri. Rajeev Sharma, Joint Secretary, DEPwD.
- 6. During his presentation, he highlighted the overall achievement by the Ministries/Departments in formulating and finalising the sector specific harmonised guidelines and appreciated the efforts made by the concerned Ministries/Departments for notifying the guidelines in egazette namely, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Ministry of Civil Aviation, Ministry of Culture and Department of sports.
- 7. The meeting then kicked off with detail discussions with all Ministries/Departments presenting the current status of work achieved by them and related concerns raised by the PwDs, which has been tabulated below:

- 8. The detailed discussion was then concluded by Hon'ble Minister (SJE) wherein he congratulated the 5 Ministries/Departments who have notified their guidelines in e-gazette. Accessibility being a topic close to the heart of Hon'ble Prime Minister, it is prudent to ensure the services and guidelines are prepared keeping PwDs as one and only focus. He appreciated the work being undertaken pertaining to accessibility in public buses, public buildings etc. and suggested that such mechanisms should be placed where NOC should not be provided if the building does not confined to the accessibility features. He urged all the participating ministries/Departments to work in unison to establish India's position as a global model for Inclusivity and keep working towards ensuring 100% accessibility.
- 9. Considering the sunset clause of AIC, he highlighted that March 2024 is not far and hence suggested to all the ministries to come forward jointly and work within the stipulated timeframe. Furthermore, he highlighted the need to build a mechanism to make remaining 44 pilgrimage places accessible for all, including the services such as training of guides in sign language interpretations so that no PwDs is deprived of adequate information and knowledge of that place. He also suggested, that just like how buses have low height entries and ramp provision for wheelchair users, we should also work towards making such provisions on railway coaches where a wheelchair user can access the coach individually and easily. It was further suggested that based on the discussion in the meeting, every ministry should work towards their respective actionable points and come together with the achievements keeping PwDs challenges and needs in their mind for the next meeting.
- 10. Shri Rajesh Yadav, Joint Secretary, DEPwD delivered closing remarks, wherein he thanked Hon'ble Minister (SJE) and MoS for their valuable inputs. The discussion hence concluded with the following inputs and suggestions by JS(RY):

- a. Standard of Procedure was initially shared by this Department vide letter dated 21.07.2022 followed with a draft model content for the notification in e-gazette. The SOP has been re-shared with all the Ministries/Departments for their reference.
- b. At the time of drafting or finalising the guidelines, PwDs should be included in the process so that not many objections and suggestions are recorded at the time of CCPD consultations, otherwise, the process gets lengthy and time taking.
- c. While finalising the guidelines, DEPwD should be informed so that in the process of finalising the guidelines, both the DEPwD and the concerned Ministry/Department may work together to overcome any discrepancies.
- d. The challenges with Department of School Education and literacy and Ministry of Information and Broadcasting should be addressed on priority basis yet it should be catered in stipulated timeframe.
- 11. The meeting was then concluded with the vote of thanks to Hon'ble Minister (SJE) and MoS.
