## 'Online e-Inspection Software' Launched at Delhi High Court by Hon'ble Dr. Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, the Chief Justice of India



Hon'ble Dr. Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, the Chief Justice of India launched the 'Online e-Inspection Software' of Delhi High Court on 24.01.2023 at the Auditorium, 'S' Block, Delhi High Court in the august presence of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Satish Chandra Sharma, Chief Justice, Delhi High Court & other Hon'ble companion

Judges of Delhi High Court. The 'Online e-Inspection Software' is an important ICT-enabled initiative of Delhi High Court which facilitates e-inspection of digitised judicial files through the internet, at the click of a mouse, from the comfort of homes/offices of concerned Advocate/litigant as per 'Instructions for

availing online e-Inspection of Digitized Judicial Files'. As of now, the link of 'Online e-Inspection Software' is available on the homepage of the official website of Delhi High Court <https://delhihighcourt.nic.in> under the heading-Online Services. However, the link will also be made available in Delhi High Court Mobile App shortly. Any Advocate/litigant registered with the Online e-Filing Portal of Delhi High Court can log into the 'Online e-Inspection Software' by providing the OTP received on his/her registered mobile number and email ID. Thereafter, the Advocate/litigant can submit his/her application in a few steps as the procedure of filing an application for online e-inspection of

a digitised judicial file is very simple. After the successful filing of the application, the Registry scrutinises the same. If the application is in order, the password-protected judicial file in PDF format is sent to the concerned Advocate/litigant at his/her registered email address by way of a web link. The password/OTP to view/download the PDF file is sent via SMS to his/her registered mobile number. The web link remains active for five days only, and the concerned Advocate/litigant can view/download the PDF file as per his/her convenience and also archive the same for future reference. 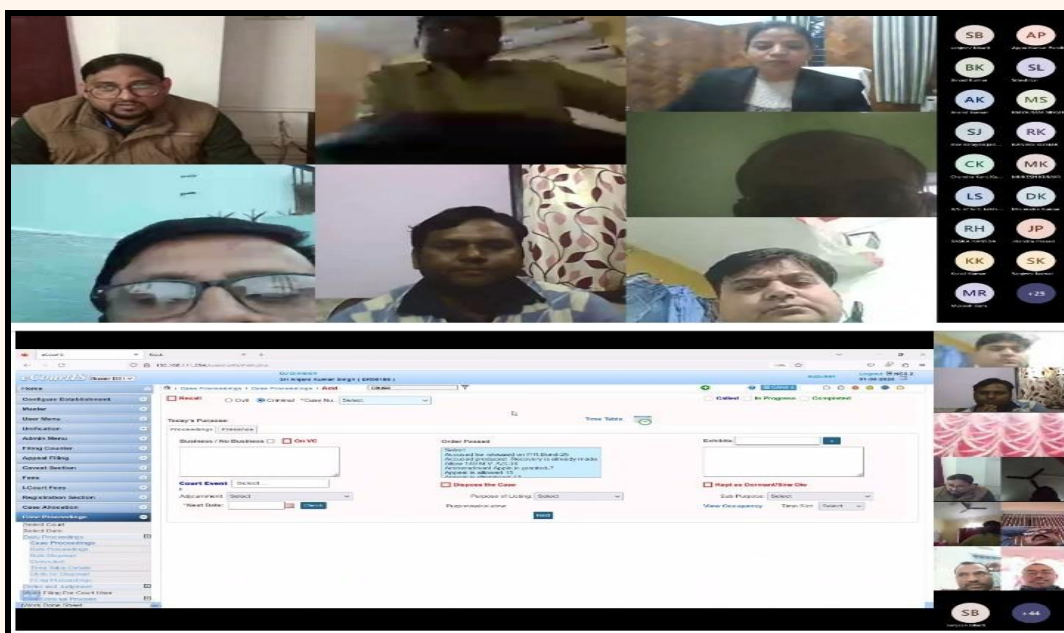

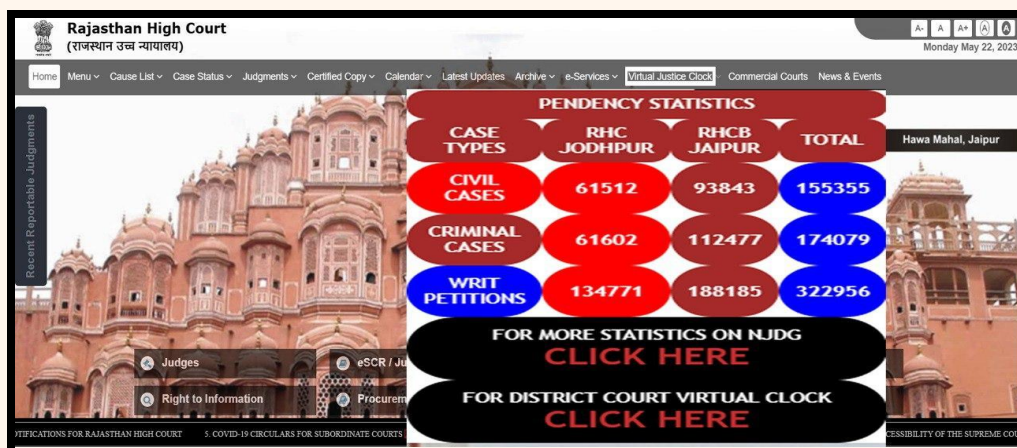
## Online Special Training for Bench Clerks of Sub Judge I of District Headquarters & Sub Division Conducted by High Court of Patna

This measure will benefit the litigant and the public at large. Virtual Justice Clocks have been

made available on the Websites of the High Court & District Courts, respectively. Virtual Justice Clock displays pendency statistics of the Rajasthan High Court, and a link to NJDG has been incorporated so that with a single click, users may reach NJDG for various statistics of institution, disposal and pendency with the age-wise breakup. This enables the stakeholders to view Justice Clock from anywhere without physically visiting the court complex.

In continuation of this office previous notification No.PA/RG/Misc./2020 dated 08.04.2020 and No.PA/RG/Misc./2021 dated 20.12.2021, it is hereby notified that from 01.01.2023, filing of following fresh cases shall be only through mandatory e-filing in terms of guidelines dated 09.01.2020 (As amended on 20.12.2021) issued for e-filing in Rajasthan High Court, copy of which is enclosed herewith: -

- (i) Commercial Appeals under Commercial Courts Act 2015
- (ii) Custom Appeal
- (iii) Central Excise Appeal
- (iv) Excise Act Reference
- (v) Income Tax Appeal
- (vi) Income Tax Reference
- (vii) Gift Tax Appeal
- (viii) Gift Tax Reference
- (ix) Wealth Tax Appeal
- (x) Wealth Tax Reference
- (xi) Wealth Tax Cases
- (xii) Excise & Gold Control Reference Application
- (xiii) Excise & Gold Control Reference
- (xiv) Goods and Service Tax Matters
- (xv) Matters related to Arbitration
- (xvi) Matters related to Intellectual Property Rights

In above cases, filing of reply, affidavit, application etc. either by private party or by Government shall also be through mandatory e-filing.

e-filing will be done on e-filing Portal of Hon'ble e-Committee, Supreme Court of India, the link of which is <https://efiling.ecourts.gov.in/raj/>.

The task of e-filing requires scanning and thereafter uploading the same on e-filing portal with relevant data entry which may be done by concerned advocate/person(s) from their home or office or any other place.

For convenience, the facility of scanning and/ or e-filing has also been made available on e-filing Counters in Rajasthan High Court Jodhpur and Jaipur Bench through M/s Enhira Software Solutions Ltd. which is already doing scanning and digitization work in Rajasthan High Court, where computer system will also be made available to concerned advocate/ litigant for the purpose of entering user ID and password on e-filing Portal. After login, required entries will be made by the personnel of the firm.

Mandatory e-Filing of all Types of Cases filed on behalf of the Central and State Government was made mandatory in the First Phase w.e.f. 01.01.2022 vide notification issued on 20.12.2021 with detailed guidelines for mandatory e-filing. In such cases for which mandatory e-Filing was notified, filing of reply, affidavit, applications etc., by private parties was also made mandatory through e-Filing to cater for the complete digitisation and future paperless courts. To boost e-filing in the High Court by using the e-filing portal of eCommittee Supreme

Court of India, e-Filing of 16 Case Types/Matters has been made mandatory w.e.f. 01.01.2023 vide notification dated 17.12.2022. In these matters, filing of reply, affidavit, application etc., either by private parties or by the Government, has also been mandatory through e-Filing.

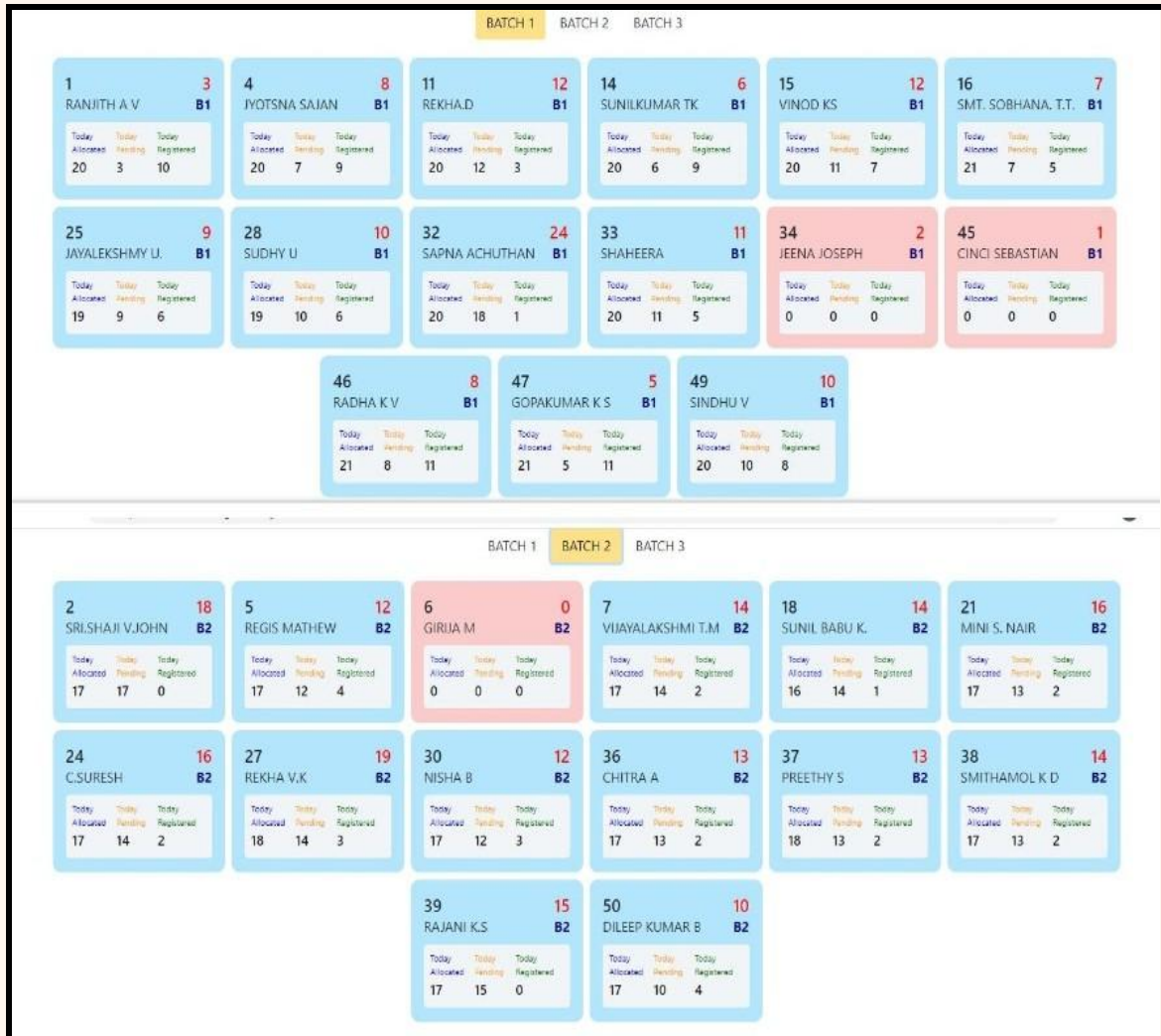
## Neutral Citation Rolled Out by Rajasthan High Court

Rajasthan High Court has implemented the Neutral Citation System for all final orders/ Judgments uploaded on its official Website. The Neutral Citation Number consisted of the following three elements: "4 Digit Year/4 Digit High Court Code/ 6 Digit auto-generated number. For Example, 2023/RJJP/000001. This number will be printed on the top left corner of every page of Judgment, and for the connected matters (bunch cases), the same neutral citation number is

applicable for relevant connected matters. On receiving the DO Letter dated 28.01.2023 of Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India along with the report of a Committee of three Judges in the matter of Common National Model of Neutral Citations, two High Court Level Teams, i.e. High Court Team-Editorial (HCTE) and High Court Team-Technical (HCTT) have been constituted to work in coordination with the Central Team to achieve the goals in phase timeline.

## Realtime Case Allocation for Scrutiny by High Court of Kerala



W.e.f. 01.01.2023, a Real-Time Scrutiny of e-files which involves scrutiny of files from 08.00 a.m. to 08.00 p.m., has been implemented in the Kerala High Court. As part of the

same, Filing Scrutiny Officers will be divided into three batches having a scrutiny time of six hours each. The Deputy Registrar / Assistant

Registrar in charge of the Filing Section shall fix the number of Filing Scrutiny Officers to be deployed in each batch.

Salient features are as follows:

- Cases, Petitions, Counters/ Documents, Caveats and Amendments will be auto-allocated to FSOs who are marked as not absent in the batch as per the batch timings (on working days).
- Auto allocation of Arbitration request cases, Petitions, Counters/ Documents, Caveats and Amendments to the Deputy Registrar of filing section.
- Auto allocation of Vakalaths to a list of Filing Scrutiny Officers and Section Officers without a time limit.
- No allocation of fresh cases after 5 pm and represented cases after 7 pm.

- Auto allocation of cases on the next working day at 8 am using a scheduled job.

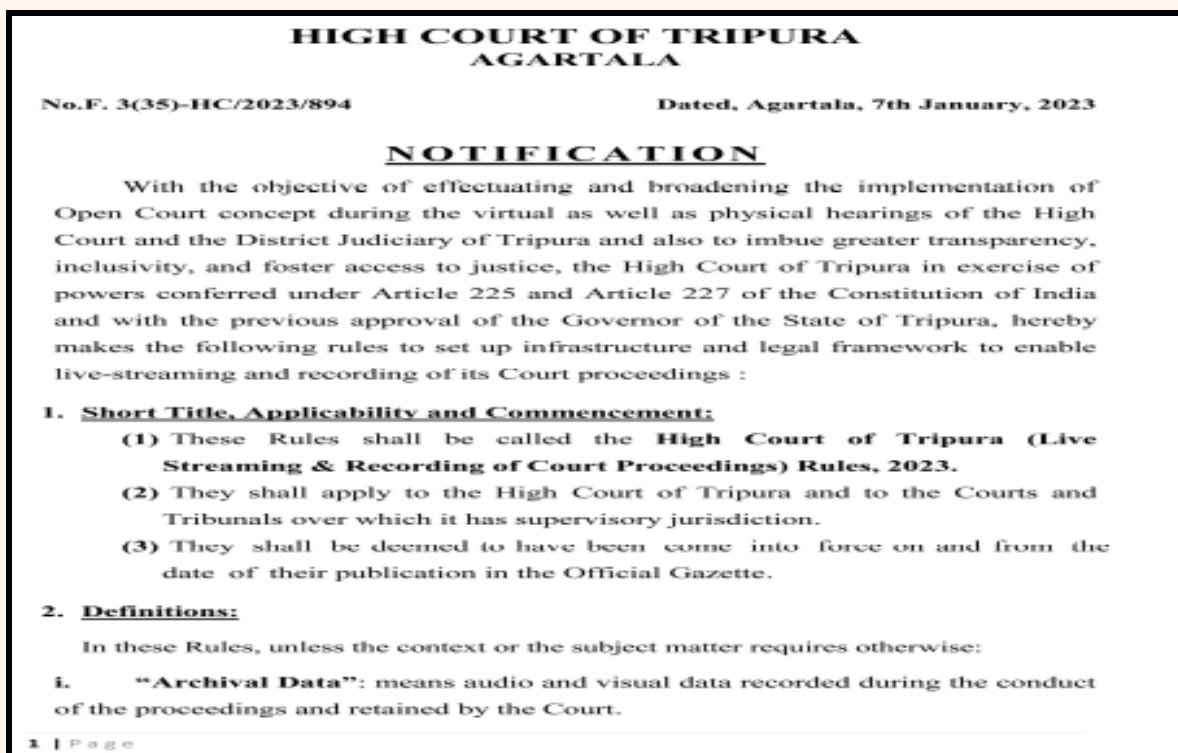
- Deployment of Filing Scrutiny Officers in each batch will be on a rotation basis, and the distribution of files will be automated.

- Work from home (WfH) option given to Filing Scrutiny Officers, subject to the approval of the Controlling Officer and shall be available over the phone during their duty time.
