This petition is filed by Advocate Thiru M. Subash Nathan, u/s 438 Cr.P.C., praying to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

## <u>ORDER</u>

Heard both. Perused the petition.

The petitioner/accused alleged to have been committed the offence u/s 294(b), 323 and 506(i) of IPC.

The case of the prosecution is that on 06.05.2023 at about 5.30 P.M., the petitioner used filthy language against the defacto complainant assaulted him with stone on his right hand and criminally intimidated him. Hence the charge.

The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent of the offences alleged against him in the FIR and except the offence u/s 506(i) of IPC, all other offences are bailable in nature and the counter case in crime No.99/2024 has been registered against the defacto complainant and his friends and this case has been falsely foisted against the petitioner and the injured was discharged from the hospital and the petitioner is ready to abide by any condition and prayed for anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that the injured was discharged from the hospital and the investigation is not yet over.

Considering the nature of the offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioner/accused and also considering the fact that the injured was discharged from the hospital, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner/accused with conditions.

In the result, in the event of arrest or on his appearing before the court concerned the petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on anticipatory bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties each for a likesum to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate, Boothapandy subject to the following conditions:-

- 1. The petitioner shall appear before the court concerned within 15 days from today without fail.
- 2. After release, the petitioner shall appear and sign before the respondent police daily at 10.00 A.M. until further orders.
- 3. The petitioner shall also make himself available before the respondent as and when required.

- 4. The petitioner shall not tamper with the witnesses or in any manner interfere with or put obstacle to the smooth progress of investigation.
- 5. The petitioner shall not leave the jurisdictional police limit without prior permission.

If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation Officer is with in his discretion to approach the court of the learned Judicial Magistrate for cancellation of bail even though bail granted by the Sessions Court as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in <a href="P.K.Shaji/Vs./State of Kerala">P.K.Shaji/Vs./State of Kerala</a>, (2005) AIR S.C.W. 5560.
