(Applicable to Judges of all Cadres)**

- i) **The Revised Norms to come into effect from the 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2020.**
- ii) **Submission of Periodical Returns of Assessment of disposal to the High Court should be once in four months.**
- iii) **Only those orders and judgments which are uploaded on the server shall be included in the periodical returns.**
- iv) **The work of the Judicial Officers shall be assessed as follows :-**

- 1) **The ratio of disposal by the Judicial Officers in respect of Main and Miscellaneous matters should be 60:40 respectively, duly certified by the concerned head of the Court viz. Principal District Judge, Chief Judge, Principal Judge, President, etc.**
- 2) **The ratio of disposal of Civil and Criminal matters should be 50:50 where the Judicial Officer has Civil as well as Criminal files in almost equal proportion.**

**Note : The ratio of disposal of Civil and Criminal matters would depend upon the extent of file of that Judge i.e. it should be proportionate to the file on Civil and Criminal side.**

- 3) **If However, the disposal on Civil side is more than 50%, such remark of not maintaining the ratio need not be communicated to the Judge.**
- 4) **No weightage should be given to disposal for the cases disposed off otherwise than what is provided earlier.**
- 5) **Weightage will be given only on one count irrespective of whether the matter is bulky/old or is decided by common Judgment.**
- 6) **The Judicial Officers whose disposal remark is Inadequate / Grossly Inadequate should send their explanations alongwith the periodical returns. Principal District Judge should ensure that the explanations for Inadequate / Grossly Inadequate disposal are forwarded alongwith the returns. If the explanations are not forwarded alongwith the returns, it shall be presumed that the concerned Judicial Officer/s has/ have no explanation to offer and the matter will be processed accordingly.**
- 7) **If the disposal of the Main and Miscellaneous matters (excluding remand matters and bail applications) falls below 85% of the total effective working days, the remark of the disposal shall be 'Inadequate.'**
- 8) **If the explanation submitted by the Judicial Officer for "Inadequate / Grossly Inadequate disposal" is accepted, the same shall be treated as 'Adequate' and the record be corrected accordingly.**
- 9) **The decision on explanation for Inadequate / Grossly Inadequate disposal shall be communicated by the Registry to the concerned Judicial Officer.**
- 10) **A Judicial Officer dealing with heavy trials involving examination of large number of witnesses and/or bulky records may request for more weightage by making an application through proper channel provided it is certified by the Principal Judge, City Civil & Sessions Court, Greater Bombay or by the Sessions Judge in the districts other than Mumbai.**

- 11) **A Civil Suit which is decided merely on the basis of documents produced and arguments submitted on a preliminary issue, such as issue regarding jurisdiction, maintainability, limitation will be given due credit as below :-**
1. **Application in the above category is decided, weightage should be given 1.50 days.**
  2. **A) A Civil Suit which is compromised / withdrawn during recording of evidence - 25% of the normal credit given to such a suit.**
    - B) A Civil Suit which is compromised at the stage of argument - 50% of the normal credit given to such a suit.**
- “Explanation :- For the purpose of this clause, 'A Civil Suit' includes Special Civil suit, Small Causes suit, Regular Civil suit, Tenancy Case, Substantive Petition and Reference.”**
- 12)
- a) **i) A Criminal case which is compounded/withdrawn during recording of evidence - 25% of the normal credit given to such a case.**
    - ii) A Criminal case which is compromised/withdrawn at the stage of argument - 50% of the normal credit given to such a case.**
  - b) In any Criminal Case, after framing of charge / after explaining particulars, is compromised / settled / withdrawn, 0.10 credit will be given.**
- 13) **If the Suit is either dismissed in default or is otherwise disposed of and Counter Claim is continued, then the same norms/credit be given to the Counter Claim on par with the disposal of suits on merits.**
- 14) **The Circular dated 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2011 issued by the Registrar General, mandating disposal of minimum 9 cases in four monthly period by the Courts dealing with CBI cases is creating anomaly. Therefore, in order to bring norms of disposal at par with the Sessions Judges, the said circular is hereby withdrawn.**
- 15) **Irrespective of the mode of trial, the offences u/s 12 of Bombay Prevention of Gambling Act be given Norms of Disposal as per Annexure D, Sr. No. 4(b).**
- 16) **Irrespective of the mode of trial, the offences u/s 66(1)(b) and 65(f) of the Bombay Prohibition Act be given Norms of Disposal as per Annexure D, Sr. No. 4(d).**
- 17) **The actual days of Summer and Christmas vacations of the Courts at District and Taluka places which are exclusively dealing with Civil matters, should not be counted as working days.**
