including a noticeable drop in the pendency of cases, reduced resource requirements and comfort of working at a convenient time and location.

## **High Court Of Punjab & Haryana mandates e-filing by Government**

### **Advocates**

The eCommittee, Supreme Court of India, has been undertaking various initiatives to transform judicial infrastructure, processes and practices. In his letter, the Chairperson of the eCommittee Dr D Y Chandrachud has requested all the High courts to make the e-filing mandatory for government cases from 1.1.2022.

Accordingly, e-filing by the office of the Advocate Generals of the States of Punjab and Haryana, office of

Senior Standing Counsel/ Standing Counsel/ Public Prosecutor/ Additional Public Prosecutor of U.T. Chandigarh and office of Additional Solicitor General of India/ Standing Counsel of Union of India has been made mandatory with effect from 1 January 2022. For the aforesaid purpose, a new policy has been framed by this Punjab and Haryana High Court and circulated amongst the stakeholders.

## **High Court of Chhattisgarh mandates e-filing of all types of petitions by the Government of Chhattisgarh**

In order to boost e-filing in the courts by using the e-filing portal given by the eCommittee of the Supreme Court of India and considering that the State Government is a major litigant before the Court, the High Court of Chhattisgarh purpose above

all types of petitions by Government of Chhattisgarh shall be instituted through e-filing by using the e-filing portal, w.e.f. 1 January 2022. For assistance, the e-filing Station at e-Sewa Kendra can be utilized.

## **1242 Subordinate Courts of Rajasthan gets dedicated VC Hardware**

The installation of dedicated VC Hardware (Camera-Mike, Document Visualizer and 43 Inch LED Display) for 1242 Subordinate Courts of Rajasthan has been successfully installed and made operational. Dedicated internet connectivity and VC software licenses have already been provided to all these courts. During the third wave of Covid-19, all the subordinate courts are functioning successfully only through Virtual Mode by using these VC resources. Procurement of hardware for newly created 50 courts has also been initiated and work orders have been placed. Thus, 1292 subordinate courts of Rajasthan will be equipped

with VC hardware and other resources.

### **VC Licenses for all the Subordinate Courts of Rajasthan**

To make video conferencing easier, user-friendly and efficient, a work order has been placed for VC Licenses for 1292 Subordinate Courts of Rajasthan during January 2022. These licenses have features that allow meeting up to 500 participants and webinars with up to 500 participants. This webinar facility may also be explored for Live Streaming for up to 500 viewers at a time.

## High Court of Tripura inaugurates eSewa Kendra at the Court Complexes of Khowai, Amarpur, Sabroom, Belonia & Bishalgarh



On 3 January 2022, Justice S. Talapatra, Judge In-Charge ICT including eCourts Projects, High Court of Tripura and Justice A. Lodh, Portfolio Judge for Khowai Judicial District, inaugurated eSewa Kendra at Khowai Court Complex. In his inaugural speech, Justice A. Lodh emphasized the importance of a help desk counter in a Court Complex like eSewa Kendra which is meant to serve the needs of the Bar members and litigants in accessing various information about the justice delivery

system. Justice S. Talapatra highlighted the importance of the establishment of eSewa Kendra at every Court complex of Tripura and said that the setting up of eSewa Kendra is a milestone. On 15th January 2022, the eSewa Kendra at Amarpur Court Complex was inaugurated by Justice S. Talapatra in a brief programme organized by the Court of SDJM-cum-Civil Judge (Jr. Division), Amarpur, Gomati Judicial District.



On 29 January 2022, three eSewa Kendras were inaugurated at the Court Complexes of Sabroom, Belonia and Bishalgarh by Justice S. Talapatra, Judge In Charge, ICT including eCourts Project, High Court of Tripura and Justice T. Amarnath Goud, Judge, High Court of Tripura and Portfolio Judge of South Tripura and Sepahijala Judicial Districts. Brief programmes were organized at the three Court Complexes for the inauguration of the eSewa Kendra. Justice T. Amarnath Goud

emphasised the importance of information-cum-facilitation counters like eSewa Kendra at a Court Complex which is meant to serve the needs of the Bar Members and the litigants in resolving their queries and serving their other needs. Justice S.

Talapatra requested the Bar Members and litigants to avail the different services eSewa Kendras so that the services under the eCourts Projects are delivered to the stakeholders on time.

### **ORDER**

The Hon'ble Chief Justice has been pleased to order that w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> January 2022, all Notifications, Circulars, Orders, Memorandums etc. to be uploaded in the official websites of the High Court and the District Courts of Tripura should be digitally signed and in Electronic Publication (ePUB) or Optical Character Recognition (OCR) based PDF only. This is issued in terms with the Rules for Accessibility as per Rule 15(1)(c) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 and the website standard as specified in the Guidelines for Indian Government Websites (OIGW) as adopted by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, Government of India.

As part of eCommittee initiative for providing digital accessible legal ecosystem and as per the standards for Indian Government Websites, adopted by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, Government of India, and also in compliance with Rule 15(1)(c)

of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 the High Court and the District Courts of Tripura w.e.f. 1 January 2022, have started uploading digitally signed Notifications, Circulars, Orders, Memorandums etc. on their official websites in Electronic Publication

(ePUB) or Optical Character Recognition (OCR) based PDF only. This e-initiative has been taken by the High Court of Tripura to ensure that the electronic documents made available in the public domain by the Tripura Judiciary meet the accessibility standards. The relevant

**The District Courts of Tripura start uploading digitally signed Judgments and Orders in the public domain w.e.f. 1st January 2022.**

To provide accessible PDF documents in the public domain through the District Courts' websites, all the courts of the District Judiciary of Tripura have started uploading digitally signed judgments and orders in OCR based PDF, from January 2022. For this purpose, all the 97 Judicial Officers of Tripura have been

provided with a Digital Signature Certificate Class-III USB Token with signature and encryption. Now, the Judicial Officers have started uploading digitally signed Judgments and Orders in the DC CIS NC 3.2 which are accessible in the NJDG portal and official websites of the District Courts.

**Cyber Crime & Cyber Law training for Judicial Officers at SVP  
National Police Academy, Hyderabad**



As part of the continuing capacity building & change management exercise of the eCommittee, the Supreme Court of India conducted a three-day online course on Cyber Crimes & Cyber Law in coordination with the Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, National Police Academy, Hyderabad from 3 to 5 December 2021. Judicial Officers from 11 states attended the three-day online course, which covered

various topics - Emerging challenges in Cyber Law Cyber Espionage, Malware Attacks, DDOS, Ransomware attack, Covid related scams, Investigation of UPI and Digital Payment Frauds; Introduction to BlockChain and CryptoCurrency; Investigation Abroad MLATs, LRs and role of Interpol; and Legal challenges in appreciation of electronic evidence.

## Sensitization Training Programme on Daily order uploading Software Module in the E-Courts Services Portal



A sensitization awareness training programme on the effective usage of the Software Module for uploading of daily orders in the e-Courts services portal (<https://ecourts.gov.in>) has been developed by the National Informatics Center, Madras High Court. The daily orders of the cases are prepared and updated/uploaded in the module and the same are reflected in the said e-Courts services portal. In coordination with NIC officials, the Registry has

conducted the sensitisation training programme from 31 January 2022 to 2 February 2022 for 145 Personal Assistants of judges on the effective usage of the software module. The advocates and litigants will benefit as the case orders will be uploaded immediately online, ensuring the case-related information and data accuracy.
