

Sub : Grant of special casual leave to District/Additional District and Sessions Judge, Delhi, during the year, 1976.

Sir,

I am directed to say that the Hon'ble Chief Justice and Judges of this Court have been pleased to order that all the District/Additional District & Sessions Judges in Delhi may be allowed special casual leave during the civil courts vacation in 1976 as under :-

- (a) Each District/Additional District & Sessions Judge who has worked as such for over ten months .....23 days.
- (b) Each District/Additional District & Sessions Judge who has worked as such continuously for six months to ten months. ....15 days.
- (c) others .....10 days.

The grant of special casual leave to the officers who are officiating District/Addl. District and Sessions Judges is subject to the condition that they continue to officiate as such till the end of the period of special casual leave. Each officer should finish as such criminal work as possible before proceeding on special casual leave so that the necessity of employing more Additional District and Sessions Judges thereafter may not arise. They may, subject to the condition that at least one of them remains on duty, avail themselves of the special casual leave on dates falling between the 31<sup>st</sup> May and 15<sup>th</sup> July, 1976(both days inclusive).

The date from which each officer proceeds on special casual leave should be communicated to this Court. It should be borne in mind that the period of special casual leave taken which should be continuous, must include all holidays so that no officer remains absent from his station for more than 23 days.

The question of making provisions under Section 10(3) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, for the disposal of urgent applications, may also be considered.
