Greetings from SAMVAD-NIMHANS on the eve of India's Independence Day!

Since the enactment of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015, the statutory provision for juvenile transfer has been the subject of significant debate and discussion. In addition, judicial officers tasked with the implementation of Section 15 of the 2015 Act, have found its implementation to be thallenging, given the existing conceptual tension between the statutory mechanism for juvenile transfer and the objectives of the JJ Act.

In light of this, and indeed, the imperative to develop an understanding of judicial approaches to juvenile transfer-related decision-making i.e., implementation of Section 15, SAMVAD-NIMHANS conducted a nation-wide study, soliciting judicial responses from all Hon'ble High Courts.

Pursuant to the above, please find attached the Final Report on the Study on

'Factors Impacting Judicial Decision-Making on Juvenile Transfer in India'.

As one of the first primary studies on judicial decision-making in the context of juvenile transfer, in India, we believe that it has important implications for the judicial officers engaged in the dispensation of juvenile justice. We, therefore, request you to kindly share and circulate this study as widely as possible to both Judges of the Hon'ble High Court, as well as judicial officers across the state (with particular reference to Principal Magistrates (JJB), Children's Court, Special Court, District and Sessions Judges).

SAMVAD will, in the coming weeks, also be conducting an online release event, in order to share the findings and engage in discussions with Hon'ble Justice Lokur and Dr Shekhar Seshadri. We will notify your Hon'ble High Court and respective State Judicial Academy regarding the event, nearer the time.

We are deeply grateful to the Hon'ble High Courts that granted us permission, and their respective State Judicial Academies, for their kind assistance in the implementation of this study. We would also like to take this opportunity to extend our sincere gratitude to Justice Madan Lokur, whose tireless efforts to facilitate this study and SAMVAD's judicial engagements on Section 15, have played an instrumental part in the genesis of this report.
