CIRCULAR

Hon'ble the Chief Justice and his companion Judges have been pleased to
to the substitution of existing Rule 30 of the "Canons of Judicial Ethics", High
Rules & Orders (Vol. IV), with a new Rule 30. The new Rule 30 reads as under:-

"30. Dress of Judicial Officers and Advocates -
The dress of the Presiding Officer should be in keeping with the dignity
of his office. Shorts and shirts-sleeves are quite unsuitable for the
Presiding Officer of a Court

Dress of gentlemen Judicial Officers:

The gentlemen Subordinate Judges and Magistrates should wear a white
shirt, black coat and necktie and grey or white trousers. The necktie will
not be worn with a high collared coat.
The gentlemen District & Sessions Judges and Additional District &
Sessions Judges should wear a white shirt and white band, black coat and
grey or white trousers.

Dress of ladies Judicial Officers:

- All ladies Judicial Officers should wear:
- (a) White/black, full length skirt, blouse/shirt
 - (b) White/black combination thereof
 - (c) White/black/charcoal long skirt (white/black/grey)
 - (d) White collar (sleeveless)
 - (e) White band and
 - (f) Full sleeved black coat

Dress of Advocates:

The dress of Advocates would be the same as provided by the Bar
Council of India Rules."



exercise of the powers conferred by Section 7 of the Delhi High Court Act, 1966 (Act 6) read with Article 227 of the Constitution of India and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the High Court of Delhi, with the prior approval of the Lt Governor of the National Capital Territory of Delhi, hereby makes the following amendments in Rules 1 & 2 of Chapter 1(A) of High Court Rules & Orders, Vol. I AND Rules 1 & 2 of Chapter 1(E) of High Court Rules & Orders, Vol. III:-

The following Rule shall be substituted for the existing Rule 1 of Chapter 1(A) of Delhi High Court Rules & Orders, Volume I:-

1. Court hours - All Civil Courts in Delhi shall sit at the same hour on every day that is not a holiday for Civil Courts. The ordinary Court hours are from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. with an interval for luncheon from 1.30 P.M. to 2.00 P.M. Saturdays shall be full working days for Courts and offices attached thereto but the second day of each month may be observed as a close day. The working hours for Courts attached to Civil Courts are from 10 A.M. to 5 P.M."

At the end of the existing Rule 2 of Chapter 1(A) of Delhi High Court Rules & Orders, Volume I, the words, "for a short time" be deleted and substituted by the following words "for such period as may be considered necessary".

The following shall be substituted for the existing Rule 1 of Chapter 1(A) of Delhi High Court Rules & Orders, Volume III:-

1. Court hours - All Criminal Courts in Delhi shall sit at the same hour on every day that is not a holiday for Criminal Courts. The ordinary Court hours are from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. with an interval for luncheon from 1.30 P.M. to 2.00 P.M. Saturdays shall be full working days for Courts and offices attached thereto but the

second Saturday of each month may be observed as a public holiday for office attached to Criminal Courts are from 10 A.M. to 5 P.M.

- IV. In the existing Rule 2 of Chapter 1 A) of Delhi High Court Rules & Orders, Volume III, the words "a short time", between the words "be continued for" and "hour" be deleted and substituted by the words "such period as may be considered necessary".
- V. The following Rule shall be substituted for the existing Rule 9 of Chapter 1 A) of Delhi High Court Rules & Orders, Volume III:-
- "9. Particulars of witnesses or parties to be noted - Care should be taken to note the parentage, age, place of residence and avocation of parties and witnesses. If a person is known by two names, or his present name is doubtful, both should be given or the doubt cleared up. It should also be noted whether a witness is called by the prosecution, or by the defence, or by the Court."

NOTE: THESE AMENDMENTS SHALL COME INTO FORCE FROM THE DATE OF THEIR PUBLICATION IN THE GAZETTE.
