(1) This Scheme may be called "The Punjab Divyanglon Shektikaran Yojna,

(2) It shall come into force on and with effect from the date of its publication in the official Gazette.

2. Context-

The Government of Punjab, in kooping with the spirit of the Rights of Persons with Disability Act, 2016, is committed to ensure protection of the rights of persons with disabilities and to provide equal opportunities to enable their full and effective participation and inclusion in society, through several ongoing and new initiatives and programmes. As per Census 2011, in Punjab, out of a population of 2.72 erore, there are 6.5 lakh disabled persons i.e. 2.14% of the population. This comprises 3.79 lakhs (58%) males and 2.74 lakhs (42%) females. The number of disabled persons is highest in the age group of 20-29 years (1.17 takhs). A majority (20%) of disabled persons have disability in movement, 12.6% have visual disability and shother 22.4% have disability in hearing, while the remaining account for other types of disabilities.

1. Barrior-free Environment

The Government of Punjab aims to provide a barder-free environment to persons with disabilities, in a phased manner as follows:

a) Government and public-centric buildings shall be made accessible.

b) Public transportation shall be made accessible.

c) Websiles shall be made accossible.

3. Punlab Divvangian Shaktikaran Yolna (PDSY)

Part-A Ongoing Schemes

The following initiatives shall be taken up and pursued in an integrated manner under orgoing schemes for the empowerment of persons with disabilities in the State:

4.1. Frac concessional travel in Government buses

Free bavel in Government buses is currently being given to blind persons in the State. One accompanying intendant shall be given the bavel along with blind pessengers.

(Action: Dopt of Transport and Dept. of Social Security, Women & Child Development)

4.2. Smart Ration Card Schome under National Food Security Act (NFSA) 2013

Smart Ration Card Scheme (SRCS), which covers 1.42 core beneficiaries in the State will be used for with irraying foodgrains from the Feir Price Shops (FPS) through e PoS machines without the need for an additional document. All the eligible PwDs shall be covered on priority, under the scheme. The defails of the family can be seen at Feir Frice Shops just by swiping the amort ration card at the e-PoS machines. The amon ration card holder will be able to withdraw (ood grains anywhere in the state irrespective of his/hér district of permenent residence. The Government has initiated the process of making 'smart ration cards with chips' to distribute subskitzed ration to BFL families.

(Action by: Dept. of Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs)

4.3 Health Insurance:

The Niramaya Health insurance Scheme is a comprehensive health insurance scheme under the National Trusts Act 1999 with an insurance cover of Rs. 1 lakh, with a single premium across all age bonds. Under the scheme, enrolment is free for PwDs with a legol guardiar (other their natural parents). To enable this, the following steps shall be taken:

- a) Identification of eligible obneficiaries having disability certificates shall be.
- b) Identification of an organization registered under National Trusts Act, shall be carried out.
- c). Online registration shall be carried out and an E-card shall be provided to the beneficiaries.

(Action: Dept. of Social Security and Women & Child Development)

4.4. Sarbat Schat Bimb Yolana (SSBY) Punlab: .

Satbat Sehat Bina Yojana (SSBY) Punjab, is a health insurança öcheme under which cost of treatment is exempted up to the limit of Rs. 5 lakh to eligible families, Under Serbet Sehat Bima Yojana (SSBY), all eligible PvOs shall be covered on priority.

(Action by: Dopt. of Health and Family Welfare)

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4.5: Earning a Livelihood: the Primary Enabler

The Punjab State Rufai Livelthood Mission (PSRLM) being run by the Department of Rural Dovelopment alms to reduce poverty by enabling poor households to access gelnful self-employment and skilled wage employment opportunities: Persons with disability shall be facilitated to draw full benefits under PSRLM Women with disability shall be motivated to join Self Help Groups (SHG) during the camps/functions under Beti Bachao Self Padhao (SBSP) and (similar schemas to enable them to become economically independent in partnership with Department of Rural Development, Punjab Skill Development Mission, NABARD and Department of Cooperation.

(Action: Departments of Rural Development and Penchayate, Social Security and Woman & Child Development: Cooperation and Employment Generation and Training (PSDIA)).

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4.6. Shop-keeping

Shops and klosks are set up at bus-stands; tourist spots and in educational institutions in Punjab, for travellers' needs and in other possible places for daily needs of local residents by various entities i.e. Tourism Department, Red Cross, «Zile Parishads, Milkfed, Department of Higher Education and Department of Transport Department. These klosks shall be allotted with preference to PwDs, to provide them with a steady source of livelihood.

(Action: Departments of Transport: Rural Development and Panchayats. Tourism; Higher Education; and Cooperation/Milklod)

4.7. Skill Development and Vocailonal Training

Skill development of PwDs shall be eldressed on priority because it is targety hampered due to tack of education, poor soft skills and inadequate entropreneutship and management training. Access to skill-based vocational training shall be made available to all PwDs right from the school level. Skillbased cooperative entrepreneurship shall be promoted emong SHGs in both urban and ural areas. Skilling/training programmes exclusively for PwDs shall also be conducted. PwD shall, in addition, be given preference in the engoing SHGs comprising PwDs shall be given training regarding the importance of ecommerce, Mohila-E-Fraet. Portal and other online marketing platforms where persons with disabilities out market their products.

(Action: Deptt of Employment Generalion and Training)

4.8. Scheme for Adolescent Gir's (SABLA)

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The main objective of the scheme is to provide nutrition to the girls in the age group of 11-14 years and school drop-out girls and to improve their socioeconomic status. Under the scheme, all disabled girls shall be covered on priority basis,

> (Action by: Depit of Social Security and Woman & Child Development)

4.6. Free Transport Facility to Students

To increase the enrolment in dovernment primary schools, the School Education Department has started work to provide free transport facilities to school children. Under the scheme, all children with disabilities shall be covered on priority.

(Action by: Depit. of School Education)

4.10 Hostel Facilities

Hostels are constructed by the Department of Social Justice & Empowerment and Minorities, for OBC boys and gets in school and colleges. Proference shall be given to cludents with disabilities belonging to Minorities and OBCs.

4.11 Free Conching

For competitive exams, free deciding will be given to all PwD candidates across the State, by the Department of Social Justice & Empowerment and Minorities.

4.12 The Ashinvad Scheme

 Unger the Ashinvad scheride, Rs. 21,000 is given at the time of the marriage of girls belonging to SC and BC families. All physically or intellectually disabled girls who tuifil the eligibility criteria of the Ashinvad Scheme, shall be covered on priority.

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4.13. Mai Bhago Villya Scheme

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Under the scheme, free bloycles are provided "to all girl students from 9th to 10th clesses studying in Government schools" with the objective of encouraging the enrolment of girl students in schools and to reduce the school dropout rate. There shall be special focus on disabled girl students under this scheme. Modern incycles shall be given to all disabled girl students.

4.14. inclusive Education for Children with Special Needs (CWSN)

Under the SAMAGRA scheme, every child with special needs, Irrespective of the kind, cetegory and degree of disability, is to be provided education in an appropriate environment. Children with mild disabilities shell be admitted to a regular school and a Special Educator will provide resource support to the achool/teacher/child on his/nor school visit. Children with moderate disabilities shall be admitted to regular schools in the resource room, an individual Education Plan shall be prepared for each child with specific goels to be achieved. Children with severe to profound degrees of disability shall be provided Home Based Education. These children are mostly bedridden or are incepable of going out of the secure environment of their homes independently. The focus in their education shall be on teaching ADL skills (Activities of Datily Living). ADL skills comprise six basis activities; enting, bathing, dressing, folleting, walking and continence. They shall also be taught' essential Life skills and given vocational training as per their condition. Under the scheme, alt eligible CWSN shall be covered.

(Action by: Depit of School Education)

4.15. Physiotherapy and Speech Therapy for Children with Special Needs (CWSII)

Physiotherapy and speech therapy shall be provided to children with special noods (CWSN) by therapists appointed at district level. In remoto/rural areas, physiotherapy shall be provided by local physiotherapists in their clinics. Two camps shall be organized daily by each physiotherapist at two different locations at the duster level, where physiotherapy shall be provided to the child and training/guidence is given to the categovor.

For widef awareness, the Department of Social Security and Warren and Child Development shall run awareness activities under the Bell Bachao Bell Padhao scheme. All needy children chait be covered under this scheme.

Travel & escoit allowance shall be provided to Children with Special Needs coming to school from far off areas. The allowance is in the form of payment to the personi ratio etc. engaged to ferry the children to school and back.

Ten meritorious rosidential senior secondary schools have been opened in Puhjab for providing free education to poor and meritoricus students of Punjab 60% seats are reserved for girls. Free load lodging, uniform, textbooks and oxire coaching is also provided.

Under the scheme, give with disabilities shall be given preference. Also, 10% reservation shall be given to give with disabilities out of the 60% scats reserved for give. There shall be 5% reservation for Persons with Disabilities out of the remaining 40% seats.

Under the scheme, all eligible Children with Special Needs (CWSN) shall be covered.

 Treatment/Surgery: An -Important component is the provision of surgical correction.and allied services to children with special needs. b) Children suffiring from Ito-threatening Illnesses like Rheumalic Heart Disbaso/

- Congonital Heart Dicease (RHD-CHD) and Thalassemia are also covered under this component and shall be treated in collaboration with the Dept. of Health, funded under National Hoolth Mission (NHM).
- c) Children suffering from cancer shall also be covered for treatment under the Chil Cancer Relief Fund.
- d) Under the scheme, all the eligible PwDs shall be covered. - b) As per the new sports policy, the Sports Department shall scient, the tob 20 players and one differently/specially spled player who have won modals in specified national or international championships/ games and perticipated in various specified international level tournaments and who have been graded on a scale of 100 points, as per guidelines. Each such player shall be given a cash award with a trophy and blacer, just like able-bodied sportspersons, as per the guidelines of the Sports Department.

428. The UDID Card: A sinale identity card for persons with disabilities

f) The UDID project is a flagship project of the Government of India. It aims at building a holialic end-to-end integrated system for basance of Universal ID & Disability Certificates to Parson with Disabilities. This project has been implemented in all 22 districts with a view to create a database for PwDs, and to Issue a Unique Disability Identity Cerd to each person with disabilities. This UDID card shall bring a nost of benefits to the Persons with Disabilities. If

b) With the UDID Cerd, periods with disabilities will not have to make multiple copies of documents or maintain or carry multiple documents, as the cord will cepture all the necessary details which can be decoded with the help of c QR (Quick Response) reader.

- d) The UDID Card will also help streamline the tracking of the physical and financial progress of the PWD baneficiery at all levels of hierarchy of implementation - at vitage, block, district, state and national level.
- e) In Punjab, 94 Government Hospitals are engaged in the issue of medical certificates/ UDID Cards and so far 1,45,928 (as on 13th Nov. 2020) UDID Cards have been issued to Persons with Disabilities: The larget is to reach out to all such persons and cover them under this infiltetive by October 2021.

427. Financial Assistance to Disabled Persona

All disabled employees of the State Government shall be entitled to 5 days of special leave in a colondar year for attending seminars/workshops on the subject of disablity. This shall include one holiday on the ove of World Disabled Day i.e. 3 Decomber of each year and theirday on the ove of the birthday of Louis Bratile 1.6. 4 January avery year.

(Action: Depit of Personnel)

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5.6 Free Education

Education upto the age of 18 years is currently fred for students with disbility. Further studies shall be free for mentorious disabled students. A scheme for the purpose shall be prepared by the Department of Higher Education.

5.9 Home Schooling Schome for Children with Special Needs.

Amid the engoing COVID-19 pandemic scenario, children with special needs (CWSN) are emong the most effected sections of society. Interruption in support due to closure of schools and restriction in the movement of support staff has rendered their life mixerable. Further, the prevolent online system of education does not care to the needs of these children because of tack of required infrastructure. Keeping in mind the problems in the existing system of education and the skeletial support system in existence for these differently-abled children due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we need a new scheme to cater to their repidly evolving needs.

There will be some children with severe degrees of disability who may not be able to attend regular school because of the severity of their disability. If they are sent to a regular school, they might not be able to cope, as they will not be able to respond to a standardized curriculum and avaluation system. A large bercentage of CWSN are deprived of their right to education due to the severe noture of their disabilities. They need a special education programme outside the purview of the regular classroom.

The Department of School Education (DoSE) shall design a special Homeschooling Scheme for Children with Special Needs in consultation with experts.

Sinte Avard for Outstanding Work Done by Teachers with Disability

Teachers with disabilities undergo vericus types of hardship. There is a need to recognize their painstaking offens in becoming teachers and then functioning as role models despite disability.

The Department of School Education shall reserve two State Teacher Awards specifically for teachers with disabilities - one for primary teachers and the other for teachers teaching at recondary tevel.

The Rural Arba Servicea Provider shall provide chargeable services. Herano will operate in his own premises and offer services like the following at prescribed rates:

- payment of online cleandity bills.

5.13 Survey and Detabace Creation at Distilici Level

The need to create a district level database for persons with disabilities has long been feit in order to kientify various needs of differently-abled portions. A database incorporating different types of disabilities viz. intellectual, hearing, locomotor and visual impairment shall be created to help in identifying the target population under various schemes of the Government.

For this purpose:

- A comprehensive protorma shall be designed to obtain information. Frontime workers shall assist in gathering requisite information from the field. through the CDPO.
- Compliation of a block level database at district level shall be done by the District Social Security Officers (DSSOs).
- District-wise data on Parsons with Disabilities shall be collected through Angenwadi Workets by fribunitvizing them @ Ro. 10 per proforma.
