In the reference 1st read above, the Hon'ble Supreme court of India vide record of ORDER: proceedings, dated 30.01.2024 in WP No.406/2013, it was directed to examine the requirement of expanding the existing jails and acquiring the land to set up new jails within the District, depending on the current capacity and future demands of the District and come with firm proposals, duly setting up a committee comprising of (i) Principal/District Judge (Chairperson of the District Legal Services Authority), (ii) District Magistrate (Incharge Administrative Head of the District on executive side), (iii) Senior Superintendent/ Superintendent of Police, (iv) Secretary of District Legal Services Authority and (v) Superintendent of the Jail/District Sub Jails Officer of concerned District and the Committee shall be notified by the State Government/Union Territories within one week from the receipt of the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority shall be the convener of the Committee. The Committees shall convene the first meeting within two weeks from the date of their constitution.

In the reference 2nd read above, the Director General of Prisons and Correctional Services, Andhra Pradesh, Mangalagiri has submitted proposals to constitute District Level Committee in each District for complying the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of

Government after careful examination of the mater hereby constitute District Level India. Committee with the following members:

District Committee for each District: Chairman Principal/District Judge(Chairperson of the District Legal OURT Services Authority) Member District Magistrate(In charge Administrative Head of the District of the District on executive side) Member Senior Superintendent/Superintendent of Police Convenor Secretary of District Legal Services Authority and 8 Superintendent of the Jail/District Sub Jails Officer of the Member concerned District

(P.T.O)

- The above Committee will assess the requirement of expanding the existing jails and acquiring the land to set up new jails within the District, depending on the current capacity and future demands of the District. The committee will also take an update on the status of all the ongoing projects/proposals that are pending in the Districts and ensure that milestones are set down for completing the ongoing projects. Wherever a project has yet to take off for want of land, steps to be taken to identify the land for the purpose of acquisition and the report be tabled before the Chief Secretary of the State Government for obtaining the necessary approval and fast tracking the process. The committees are permitted to examine the needs of the respective Districts and make proposals over and above of those that have been laid down the Model Prison Manual. However, the minimum requirements prescribed under the said Manual shall not be compromised. Future projections shall span over in a period of (50) years for implementation.
- Besides the above, the committees shall also keep in mind the requirement of incorporating Artificial Intelligence and introducing Video Conferencing for conducting Mulakaats and tele-medicine facilities for the ease of the inmates.

UPON hearing the counsel, the Court made the following O R D E R

1. At the very outset, Registry is directed to correct the cause title of the

case in hand as "IN RE - INHUMAN CONDITIONS IN 1382 PRISONS".

- 2. On the last date of hearing, all the State Governments/Union Territories were called upon to furnish details as mentioned in paragraph 3 of the said order. Barring for the States of Maharashtra and Jharkhand, all the remaining States Governments/Union Territor es have furnished the requisite information. Based on the said information, Mr. Gaurav Agrawal, learned Senior counsel (Amicus Curiae) has prepared two compilations summarizing the responses received from the State Governments/Union Territories.
- the number of Central Jails/District Jails/Sub-Jails in each State/Union Territory and the response of the State Governments/Union Territories regarding the steps taken to set up more jails. A perusal of the statements prepared shows that there is hardly any proposal worth the while that has come from the States of Bihar, Rajasthan, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh. In some cases, the State Governments have furnished collective information instead of giving a District-wise breakdown of the capacity/occupancy of each jail, which makes it difficult for this Court to assess the extent of occupancy vis-à-vis the permissible capacity on a jail-wise basis. Further, in some cases it has simply been stated by the concerned State Governments that "work is under progress" for constructing more jails without furnishing the stage of the said progress.
- 4. In the first instance, it is deemed appropriate to impose costs of

₹10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) each on the States of Maharashtra and Jharkhand for non-compliance of the order passed on 14th December, 2023. The costs shall be deposited with the Supreme Court Group 'C' (Non-Clerical) Employees Welfare Association within four weeks.

- 5. On going through the compilation of responses received from the State Governments/Union Territories and it appears that in most cases, the extent of overcrowding in the Central Jails/District Jails/Sub-Jails is over 10% of the permitted capacity. In some cases, the occupancy *vis-à-vis* the actual capacity of jails exceeds 40% to 50%. These figures are stark and worrying. They need to be addressed on priority.
 - 6. On carefully examining the information furnished in the compilations and recommendations made by the learned Amicus Curiae, we are of the opinion that it would be appropriate to issue directions to constitute a Committee in each District of the States/Union Territories to do the following:
 - (i) Assess the available infrastructure in jails and take a decision on the number of additional jails to be constructed in the Districts;
 - (ii) to assess the current capacity of the existing jails and requirement of constructing more jails or enhancing the capacity of existing jails to meet the standard laid down in the Model Prison Manual, 2016.
 - (iii) Besides the above, the Committees shall also keep in mind the requirement of incorporating Artificial Intelligence and introducing video conferencing for conducting Mulakaats and tele-medicine facilities for the

ease of the inmates.

- 7. Each State Government/Union Territory is directed to set up a Committee comprising of (i) Principal/District Judge (Chairperson of the District Legal Services Authority), (ii) District Magistrate (Incharge Administrative Head of the District on Executive Side), (iii) Senior Superintendent/Superintendent of Police, (iv) Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority and (v) Superintendent(s) of Jail. The said Committee shall be notified by the State Governments/Union Territories within one week from the date of receipt of this order. The Secretary of the DLSA shall be the convenor of the Committee. The Committees shall convene the first meeting within two weeks from the date of their constitution.
- 8. The Committees shall initiate steps to examine the requirement of expanding the existing jails and acquiring land to set up new jails within the District, depending on the current capacity, occupancy and future demands of the District and come up with firm proposals. The Committees will also take an update on the status of all the ongoing projects/proposals that are pending in the Districts and ensure that milestones are set down for completing the ongoing projects. Wherever a project has yet to take off for want of land, steps be taken identify the land for the purposes of acquisition and the report be tabled before the Chief Secretary, of the State Government/Union Territory for obtaining necessary approvals and fast tracking the process. The Committees are permitted to examine the needs of the respective Districts

and make proposals over and above of those that have been laid down the Model Prison Manual. However, the minimum requirements prescribed under the said Manual shall not be compromised. Future projections shall span over in a period of at least 50 years for implementation.

- 9. A Fresh Status Reports shall be filed by all the State Governments/Union Territories on or before 05th April, 2024. An affidavit shall be filed by Chief Secretary of each State /Union Territory with all the requisite information as directed ordered above, within the same time line.
- 10. List on 09th April, 2024, at 2.30 p.m.
