Subject: Expediting Disposal of Cases under Fast Track Special Courts

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to draw your kind attention to a matter of utmost importance namely expeditious disposal of rape and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012 cases.

- 2. As you are very well aware, the Department of Justice initiated a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) in October 2019, in accordance with the Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2018. The primary objective of this Scheme was to establish Fast-Track Special Courts (FTSCs) to ensure swift resolution of cases related to rape and the POCSO Act. The initial vision encompassed setting up of 1023 FTSCs, including 389 exclusive POCSO Courts, based on the prevailing caseload, which stood at 1.67 lakh cases as of March 31, 2018. The Scheme was intended initially for a period of one year spread over two Financial Years 2019-20 and 2020-21 and was extended for two more years i.e. up to March 2023. Further extension of the Scheme is at an advanced stage and is awaiting approval of the Cabinet.
- 3. It is heartening to note that substantial progress has been made in the disposal of cases since the inception of the Scheme. As of 31.07.2023, a total of 754 FTSCs, including 411 exclusive POCSO Courts, have been established and operationalized across 29 States/Union Territories. These courts have disposed of 1,80,294 cases, thereby contributing significantly to the cause of justice.
- 4. However, an analysis of the ongoing situation reveals a persistent challenge. It has been noticed that approximately 6500 cases are registered each month, while the disposal rate hovers around 5,000 to 6,000 cases. Consequently, the backlog of pending cases continues to grow. As of July 2023, the combined pendency of rape and POCSO Act cases across all the courts in the country stands at a staggering figure of over 4,98,000 cases. This warrants immediate attention and quick action.

- 5. Given the paramount importance of ensuring the safety and security of women and children in our society, it is imperative that the FTSCs operate with optimal efficiency. In the light of this, I humbly request your personal intervention in the following matters:
 - In order to address the challenge of the mounting backlog of pending cases as well as expeditious resolution of new cases being filed, I solicit your kind support in providing necessary instructions and resources to the concerned courts. Additionally, I request the establishment of a robust monitoring mechanism by the High Courts to ensure time-bound disposal of cases by the FTSCs.
- II. It may be emphasized that the recent amendment to Section 309 of the CrPC stipulates the completion of trials related to rape and child rape offences within a span of two months from the date of filing of the charge sheet. It may be noted that as per the data submitted by the High Courts on the dashboard of the Department for the period 01.01.2023 to 31.07.2023, only 4.53% of the total cases disposed of, have been disposed of within 2 months (State-wise details are placed at Annexure-I). In view of the above, I request your kind cooperation in ensuring compliance of the said amendment, which will go a long way in expediting the delivery of justice.
- 6. I wish to reiterate that the Department of Justice, Government of India, stands firmly committed to supporting all the States/UTs in achieving our shared objective of expeditious and equitable justice delivery to all the citizens of our country. The safety and well-being of our women and children are of paramount importance. I am confident that your concerted efforts will definitely help in lessening the burden of pending cases and foster a more just society.
