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Referring to the topic and instructions under the references, the statistics reveal that the warrants issued by the relevant courts do not add up to the warrants entrusted to the concerned police, according to information from the relevant courts and data from the concerned superintendent of police. It has been noted that there is a significant backlog of warrants in numerous courts, issued under various conditions and stages. This backlog has increased since the warrants have not been turned over to the relevant police. It seems that the stages of warrant issuance, entrustment, and execution were not completed correctly.

The issuance of warrants, proper entrustment to the parties involved, and execution must all be done concurrently in accordance with proper process, taking into account the instructions and the alarming pendency of warrants while aiming to lessen the pendency.

The warrants that were issued as per the record but not entrusted to the concerned in all IPC and non-IPC cases must now be entrusted to the concerned police for effective execution. As a result, all judicial officers are hereby instructed to pay proper attention to the cases where warrants were issued but not entrusted or the circumstances under which warrants were issued, reasons for pendency, and see that. All judicial officers must ensure that the number of warrants pending in each court corresponds to the number of warrants pending with the relevant SHOs and that both amounts are added together. By October 27, 2023, without fail, all judicial officers must abide by this and send a compliance report about the entrustment of warrants to the district court. If not, the report must include the reasons why.

This must be followed regularly. Concerned CAO/Sr. SO/SO are in charge of ensuring that the warrants are correctly handed over and are accountable for following the rules.
