Clarification on Status of Advocates Enrolled Prior to Clearing AIBE - Reference to ROC No. 286 of 2024 dated 13.09.2024

Madam,

I write in response to your letter ROC No. 286 of 2024, dated 13.09.2024, seeking clarification regarding the status of advocates enrolled before passing the All India Bar Examination (AIBE).

Frankly, it is perplexing that such a request for clarification is being raised on an issue that has long been resolved, particularly in light of the Bar Council of India's (BCI) Directive/Circular of 2013.

Allow me to remind the Bar Council of Andhra Pradesh of the Bar Council of India's directive No. BCI:D:15/6/STBC CIR NO. 4/2013 (Council), dated 12.04.2013, which was communicated to all State Bar Councils.

This directive unequivocally established that individuals enrolled by State Bar Councils as advocates prior to passing the AIBE are provisionally enrolled and issued a "Provisional Certificate of Enrolment."

The contents of this directive are widely known across the country and all State Bar Councils, including the Bar Council of Andhra Pradesh.

However, it appears necessary to reiterate them here.

The BCI's 2013 circular made it abundantly clear that provisionally enrolled advocates are permitted to practice law across India.

However, the same circular mandates that they must clear the AIBE within two years of enrollment to continue practicing.

There is absolutely no ambiguity in this matter.

Moreover, during this provisional period, enrolled advocates are naturally expected to adhere fully to all professional norms, including filing Vakalatnama in courts, wearing the mandatory advocates dress code including prescribed band while appearing in any court, and the gown when appearing specifically before the High Courts and the Supreme Court, as required by the legal profession's code of conduct.

I trust this response conclusively addresses the matter at hand and reaffirms the settled position of the Bar Council of India, leaving no room for further uncertainty.
