This petition is coming up on this day before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru.B.Senthilkumar, Learned Counsel for the petitioner and the Learned Public Prosecutor for the State and this Court passed the following:

<u>ORDER</u>

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:

On 20.04.2024 at about 7.00 p.m., the petitioner and his father assaulted the victim with wooden log and brick while attacking both the petitioner and accused No.1 were inebriated state. Therefore the case registered against them U/s.294(b), 326 and 506 (ii) of IPC and 4 of TamilNadu Provision of Harassment of Women Act 2002.

- 3. Heard both sides.
- 4. The points for determination is the can anticipatory bail be granted to the petitioner?

Answer:

- 5. The FIR and reply given by police are persued. The specific overtact against the petitioner is that he assaulted the complainant's husband with brick. Further the victim was discharged from the hospital. Also the accused No.1 was released on bail by the Judicial Magistrate. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, I inclined to release the petitioner on anticipatory bail
- 6. Therefore it is ordered that in the event of his arrest by the Respondent or on his surrender before the Learned Judicial Magistrate at Aundipatti within 15 days from the date of this order, he shall be released on anticipatory bail on his executing a bond for sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) with two sureties each for a like sum. Following conditions are imposed on the petitioner:-
- i) He shall appear before the SHO Rajathani Police Station daily at 10.00 a.m., and 5.00 p.m., for the period of 25 days from the date of release on bail.
- ii) The petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witnesses either during the investigation or trial.
- iii) The petitioner shall not abscond either during the investigation or trial.
- 7. On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the Learned Magistrate / Trial court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs- State of Kerala (2005) AIR SCW 5560).

8. If the petitioner/accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
