**ORDER**

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

**2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows :-**

The petitioner and co-accused conducted Chit without license. Thereby the petitioner and co-accused cheated the complainant to the tune of Rs.23,75,000/-. On questioning the same the petitioner and co accused intimidated the complainant with dire consequences. Hence the case registered against them U/s.406, 420, 120(B) and 506(i) of IPC.

4. The points for determination is that can the petitioner be released on anticipatory bail ?

**Answer :**

5. The FIR and reply given by the Police are perused. The FIR prima facie reveal that the petitioner and her family members cheated the complainant to the tune of Rs.23,75,000/- by conducting unauthorized Chit Fund. The prosecution objected that the accused No.2 who is husband of the petitioner is still at large and yet to be arrested. Further the prosecution submitted that the investigation is still pending and if the petitioner released on bail she would abscond. The investigation is underway. The amount involved in the crime is huge, so further investigation is necessary for bringing out the truth. Also there is possibility for absconding. Considering all the facts into the account and no change of circumstances made out after dismissing the earlier bail petition, I am not inclined to release the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

**In result, this anticipatory bail petition is dismissed.**
