ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.439 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:

On 22.04.2024 at 9.30 a.m., when the police party was watching suspicious movement in the area of Kottakudi river bridge, the accused carried with him a gun without license. On investigation it is revealed that the petitioner used to hunt wild animals with the gun. Therefore case registered against the petitioner U/s.25 (1B) (a) of Arms Act.

- 4. The points for determination is that can bail be granted to the petitioner?

Answer:

5. The FIR and reply given by the police are perused. The FIR prima facie shows that the petitioner is found with carrying gun for which he has no license further it reveals that the petitioner used to hunt wild animals with the gun. The prosecution submitted that the investigation is still pending and if released on bail, he would abscond. Since the investigation is pending, it is premature to release the petitioner on bail and no change of circumstances made out after dismissing the earlier bail petition. So the petition is liable to be dismissed.

In fine, the petition is dismissed.
