This petition is coming up on this day before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru. M.Kamaraj, Learned Counsel for the petitioners and the Learned Public Prosecutor for the State and this Court passed the following:

ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioners/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:-

On 16.04.2024 at 8.35 p.m., the petitioners assaulted the complainant and caused injuries. Further they abused her with filthy language and intimidated her with dire consequences. Therefore the case registered against the petitioners U/s.147, 294(b), 323 and 506(i) of IPC and 4 of TNPHW Act.

- 3. Heard both sides.
- 4. The points for determination is that can the petitioners be released on anticipatory bail?

Answer:

5. The FIR and reply given by the Police are perused. The FIR transpires that one Senthil is News Reporter. He is son of the complainant. The Senthil reported in newspaper that ditch erected in the locality is substandard. The petitioners who are the political party enraged over the report published by the Reporter Senthil, assaulted the complainant and his son and intimidated him with dire consequences. So the FIR prima facie shows that the petitioners committed serious offence agaisnt the complainant. Having considered the same and no change of circumstances made out after dismissing the earlier bail petition, I am not inclined to release the petitioners on anticipatory bail.

In result, this bail petition is dismissed.
