ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioners/accused U/s.439 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:

On 04.05.2024 at about 9.30 p.m., the petitioners stabbed the complainant with lethal weapon and causing grievious injuries. Further they intimidated them with dire consequences. Therefore the case registered against the petitioner s U/s.120(b), 294(b), 342, 307 and 506(i) of IPC

5. The FIR and records are perused. The FIR transpires that on 04.05.2024 at about 9.30 p.m. the petitioners stabbed the complainant with lethal weapon and caused grievious injuries.
