ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:-

When the complainant returned to his home, she found that her house was broken open and an unknown person attempted to steal valuable properties kept in the bureau. So case registered U/s.457 and 511 of IPC.

5. The FIR and records are perused.
