<u>ORDER</u>

This petition has been filed by the petitioners/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows :-

The petitioners and co-accused cheated the complainant to the tune of Rs.17,79,942/-. They conspired and cheated the complainant. Therefore case registered against them U/s.417, 420, 120(B), 294(b) and 506(i) of IPC.

3. Heard both sides including intervener.

4. The points for determination is that can the petitioners be released on anticipatory bail ?

<u>Answer</u> :

5. The FIR and records are perused. As disclosed from the FIR, the petitioners and co-accused allegedly cheated the complainant to the tune of Rs.17,79,942/-. Also they conspired to commit such offence. The prosecution submitted that the investigation is still pending and the petitioners would abscond if released on bail. Having considered the above grounds, I am not inclined to release the petitioners on anticipatory bail.

In result, this anticipatory bail petition is dismissed.
