### <u>ORDER</u>

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

### 2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows :-

On 16.03.2024 during night Laptop, Electric accessories and CPU were stolen from the house of the complainant. Therefore case registered U/s.457 and 380 of IPC.

3. Heard both sides.

4. The points for determination is that can the petitioner be released on anticipatory bail ?

### <u>Answer</u> :

5. The FIR transpires that electronic properties being kept in the house of complainant were stolen during night. The value of the properties in total is Rs.30,000/-. As submitted by the prosecution, the petitioner would abscond, if released on bail. The offence alleged to have been committed by the petitioner is lurking house trespass and theft. In connection with electronic things. So further investigation is necessary to recover the stolen properties. Having regard to the above facts, the petitioner is not entitled for bail.

# In result, this anticipatory bail petition is dismissed.
