## <u>ORDER</u>

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.439 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking bail.

## 2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:

On 09.03.2024 at 10.00 a.m., the accused no.1 murdered his wife by strangulation, the petitioners abetted the crime. Therefore the case registered against the petitioners and co-accused U/s.147, 294(b), 109, 498(A) and 302 of IPC.

3. Heard both sides.

4. The points for determination is that can bail be granted to the petitioners?

## Answer :

5. The FIR and records are perused. As revealed from the FIR, on 09.03.2024 at 10.00 a.m. the accused no.1 murdered his wife by strangulation. Prior to the incident, the petitioners who are sisters of accused no.1, abetted the crime. The prosecution submitted that the investigation is under way and if released on bail, the petitioners would abscond. Having considered the objection that the investigation is underway and the petitioner would abscond if released on bail, I am not inclined to release the petitioner on bail.

## In fine, the Bail petition is dismissed.
