<u>ORDER</u>

This petition has been filed by the petitioners/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:

On 30.04.2024 at 1.00 P.M. the petitioners abused and intimidated the complainant with dire consequences. Therefore the case registered against the petitioners U/s.294(b), 436 and 506 (i) of IPC and section.4 of TNPHW Act.

3. Heard both sides.

4. The points for determination is that can Anticipatory bail be granted to the petitioners?

Answer :

5. The FIR would show that the petitioners and co-accused abused with filthy language and intimidated the complainant with dire consequences. Further the co-accused exposed himself nude before the complainant. The prosecution submitted that the investigation is underway and if released on bail, they would abscond. Taking the fact into account that the investigation is underway, the petitioners are not entitled for Anticipatory bail at this premature stage.

In fine, the Anticipatory bail petition is dismissed.
