ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.438 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:

On 08.05.2024 at 6.00 p.m. the petitioners abused the complainant and kicked him as well as intimidated them with dire consequences. Therefore the case registered against the petitioner U/s.294(b), 323 and 506 (ii) of IPC.

5. The FIR transpires that the complainant and his coummunity people rented out a shop to the Petitioner No.1. Having regard to the anticidents of the petitioner as well as the nature of the offence, I am not inclined to release the petitioner on anticipatory bail.
