This petition is coming up on this day before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru.S.Kajamydeen, Learned Counsel for the petitioners and the Learned Public Prosecutor for the State and this Court passed the following:

ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioners/accused U/s.439 of Code of Criminal Procedure seeking bail.

2. The Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows:

On 07.05.2024 evening the petitioner No.1 hacked the Arunkumar to death. Other petitioners armed with weapon gave a chase to the deceased while he was murdered. Therefore case registered against them U/s.294(b), 342, 302 r/w 34 of IPC and 506(ii) of IPC.

- 3. Heard both sides.
- 4. The points for determination is that can the petitioners be released on bail?

Answer:

Records perused. The FIR would unfold that the petitioner No.1 gave a long chase to the deceased, Arunkumar and allegedly murdered him. Other petitioners also chased the deceased while he was murdered by the petitioner No.1. The occurrence took place on previous enmity between the petitioners and deceased. As submitted by the prosecution, the investigation is underway. If the petitioner released on bail, they would again pose threat to the victim family. The petitioner would also tamper with prosecution witnesses. Further the petitioners would abscond if released on bail. Having considered the serious nature of offence and strong objection made by the prosecution, the petitioners are not entitled for bail at this stage. So the petition is liable to be dismissed.

In result, this bail petition is dismissed.
