Regulation 11(iv) of the Regulations regarding Advocates-on-Record

Examination reads as under:

"A candidate shall not be allowed more than five chances at the

examination.

Appearance even in any one of the papers in an examination

shall be deemed to be a chance."

However, considering the fact that the Covid pandemic afflicted the world in the years

2020 and 2021, the Competent Authority has been pleased to direct that the

Advocates-on-Record Examination held in December, 2021 shall not be reckoned as a

chance while counting the permissible five chances under Regulation 11(iv).

Accordingly, as one-time relaxation, one more chance will be given to the eligible

candidates on the basis of their result in the last examination they appeared at.

As further directed, this one-time relaxation as regards non-reckoning of

attempt made at the Advocates-on-Record Examination-December, 2021 while

counting the permissible five chances, will not be treated as a precedent and the

provisions contained in Regulation 11(iv) of the Regulations regarding Advocates-on-

Record Examination shall be binding on all prospective candidates at the Advocates-

on-Record Examinations to be held in the years to come.
