Dear Chief Justice

The Supreme Court of India has launched the electronic version of the Supreme Court Reports (e-SCR). This is an initiative to provide the digital version of the Judgments of the Supreme Court as they are reported in 'Supreme Court Reports', the official law report.

This project endeavors to take a step forward towards fulfilling the objective of the digitization of the Indian Judiciary for the benefit of litigants, judges, members of the Bar, law colleges and universities, governmental institutions, law clerks and researchers, judicial academies, civic society and the public at large, e-SCR will facilitate access to the judgments of the Supreme Court, free of subscription or any other expense for the user.

The data base of e-SCR contains at present about 34,000 reported judgments of the Supreme Court. The search facility in e-SCR provides for free text search, search, within search, case type and case year search, judge search, year and volume search and bench strength search options. The inbuilt elastic search facilitates quick and user-friendly search results.

You may also consider of providing access to the link of e-SCR on the official website of your High Court.
