Subject: Mandatory use of LED lamps in Government Offices.

My Dear Deputy Commissioner,

You are aware that the Haryana Government has made the use of LED lamps / tube lights mandatory in all Central / State Govt. offices and Public Sector Undertaking institutions or establishments located in the State of Haryana vide Order No. 22/52/2005-5P dated 29.06.2016 (available www.hareda.gov.in). Vide this order; the use of incandescent lamps and purchase of sodium vapour lamps by Govt. sector / Govt. added sector / Boards and Corporations or Autonomous bodies of Haryana was also banned. However, it has been observed that many Government Departments have not fully complied with these orders. The matter was reviewed in a meeting held on 04.06.2018 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana and this non-compliance by various departments / boards & corporations / agencies has been viewed seriously. In connection with celebration of World Environment Day, 2018, Government has identified five activities to be taken up on priority in a time bound manner. C.M. has directed to replace all halogen and sodium bulbs and tubelights in the State with energy-efficient LED bulbs and tubelights. To begin with, it has been decided to effect this replacement in Government Buildings by August 15, 2018.

In view of this, I would request you to ensure the following:

- i) Monitor the enforcement of these orders personally.
- ii) Services of Saksham Yuvas may be utilized for 100% monitoring of Central / State Govt. offices and report in this regard may be sent to the Director, New & Renewable Energy (DNRE), Haryana within one month.
- iii) Concerned Departments / Organizations may be given deadline of 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2018 to replace all inefficient lightings with LED lamps. Accordingly, compliance may again be verified and a report in this regard be sent to the DNRE by 15<sup>th</sup> September, 2018.
