

## **MEDIATION FOR THE NATION DRIVE 2.0**

Building upon the success of the Mediation for the Nation Drive campaign, the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), in association with the Mediation & Conciliation Project Committee (MCPC), Supreme Court of India, has launched **Mediation 'For the Nation' Drive 2.0** commencing from **2nd January, 2026**.

This subsequent phase of the campaign aims to further strengthen the mechanism of amicable dispute resolution by expanding the scope and intensifying efforts to settle a larger number of pending cases across Taluka Courts, District Courts and High Courts throughout the country. The drive continues under the aegis of Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India and the Executive Chairman, NALSA.

Under Drive 2.0, renewed emphasis is being laid on referring eligible cases to mediation at the earliest stage, thereby reducing pendency and promoting a culture of peaceful settlement. All categories of cases suitable for mediation, including Matrimonial Disputes, Accident Claims, Domestic Violence, Cheque Bounce, Commercial Disputes, Service Matters, Criminal Compoundable cases, Consumer Disputes, Debt Recovery, Partition, Eviction, Land Acquisition and other civil matters, are being actively considered under this campaign.

The Gujarat State Legal Services Authority once again urges all litigants to take advantage of this initiative by approaching the nearest Mediation Centre and resolving their disputes amicably, thereby contributing to the success of Mediation 'For the Nation' Drive 2.0.
