

Scheme for Adoption of Animals/Birds in the Zoos & Deer Park in Haryana



#### **Procedure for Adoption:**

- One may adopt as under:
- Slect a site of your choice, a zoo or the deer park
- Pick your favourite animal exhibited in the zoo as given in the list.
- Choose your support for month/year
- Fill the form overleaf and hand it to the concerned
- zoo incharge.
- You can gift an adopted animal to your family, friends and associates.
- If in any case your favorite animal is already adopted, your name will be put in the waiting list and as soon as the animal is available you will be informed.

#### Note:

- A minimum of 10 birds shall have to be adopted.
- For the young ones of the above animals such as calves, cubs, chicks, fawns etc. the charges will be half of the above amount.
- Birds and Animals are subject to change.
- Cheque/DD to be made in the name of Chief Wildlife Warden Haryana Panchkula.

There are three small Zoos in Haryana located at Pipli (Kurukshetra), Rohtak and Bhiwani. There is also one Deer Park in Hisar District located on Dhansu Road. They help to educate the public, particularly school children and farmers about habits and habitats of wildlife.
