Proceedings of the 8th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife, Haryana held on 03.12.2025 at 11:00 AM in the Committee Room, 4th Floor, Haryana Civil Secretariat, Chandigarh under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana.

The 8th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife, Haryana was held on 03.12.2025 at 11:00 AM in the Committee Room, 4th Floor, Haryana Civil Secretariat, under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Haryana, Sh. Nayab Singh Saini. Rao Narbir Singh, Minister in-charge of Forests & Wildlife attended the meeting as Vice-Chairperson. The meeting was attended by all the members of the State Board for Wildlife including Sh. Sudhir Rajpal, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Environment, Forest & Wildlife, Government of Haryana; and Dr. Vivek Saxena, IFS, PCCF (Wildlife) & Chief Wildlife Warden as Member-Secretary of SBWL.

Copy of the agenda of the 8th Meeting is annexed as **Annexure-I**.

The list of all the participants is annexed as **Annexure-II**.

At the outset, Sh. Sudhir Rajpal, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Environment, Forest & Wildlife, Government of Haryana welcomed the Chairman and all the participants. Dr Vivek Saxena, IFS, PCCF (Wildlife) & Chief Wildlife Warden explained the agenda item wise as under:

The State Board for Wildlife, Haryana was constituted vide notification dated 13.09.2013 in accordance with amendment in Wildlife (Protection) Act 1972. The copy of notification is annexed as **Annexure-III**.

The Board was reconstituted vide notification dated 29.07.2015 of the State Government. The copy of notification is annexed as **Annexure-IV**.

Agenda Item 8.1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 7th Meeting of SBWL

The 7th meeting of the State Board for Wildlife was held on 30.09.2023 and the minutes were circulated to all the members of the SBWL vide Chief Wildlife Warden, Haryana letter No. 1158-1173 dated 06.10.2023, inviting comments/suggestions, if any. As no comments were received from any member on the said minutes, therefore, the agenda Item No. 8.1 was placed for confirmation of the Minutes of the 7th Meeting of SBWL.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board confirmed the minutes of the 7th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife, Haryana held on 30.09.2023.

Agenda Item 8.2: Action Taken Report on Decisions of the 7th Meeting

Item wise Action Taken Report (ATR) on the decisions taken in the 7th meeting held on 30.09.2023 was placed before the Board for information and consideration.

The ATR of 7th Meeting of SBWL included, inter alia, the status of following proposals:

- (i) Affordable Group Housing by M/s Mega Infratech Pvt. Ltd. in the Eco-Sensitive Zone of Sultanpur National Park; and
- (ii) Diversion of forest land for New BG Railway Line from Chandi Mandir to Baddi.

It was apprised to the Board that the proposal of Diversion of forest land for New BG Railway Line from Chandi Mandir to Baddi has been approved by Standing Committee of the National Board for Wildlife (SC-NBWL) in its 75th meeting. Accordingly, the approval has been issued by CWLW, Haryana.

The Standing Committee of the National Board for Wildlife (SC-NBWL), in its 83rd meeting, decided not to recommend the proposal of Affordable Group Housing by M/s Mega Infratech Pvt. Ltd. in the Eco-Sensitive Zone of Sultanpur National Park until an Action Taken Report is submitted on violations in ESZ of Sultanpur National Park to the Integrated Regional Office and MoEF&CC, GoI.

PCCF(Wildlife)& Chief Wildlife Warden-cum-Member Secretary, SBWL briefed about the present status in respect of Action Taken Report, which was still awaited from the Deputy Commissioner, Gurugram, who is Chairman of the Eco Sensitive Zone monitoring committee as per the notification. Chairman SBWL, i.e. Hon'ble Chief Minister, enquired about the present status and timeline for submission of the action taken report. Deputy Commissioner Gurugram assured that action taken report will be submitted by 4th December, 2025.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board took note of the ATR of the 7th Meeting on the above proposals and also took note of the observations of the National Board for Wildlife regarding violations in the Eco Sensitive Zone of Sultanpur National Park and decision of NBWL that further proposals in respect of projects falling within the Eco Sensitive Zone (ESZ) of Sultanpur National Park will be

considered only after the submission of Action Taken Report in respect of findings of the committee, identifying the list of violations, constituted by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India.

Hon'ble Chairman, SBWL also directed that a communication be sent by PCCF (Wildlife) & CWLW to all the Chairman and Member Secretaries of the notified ESZ for regularly convening the meetings and ensure compliance of the conditions, prohibited and regulated activities in accordance with the respective notifications.

Agenda Item 8.3: Status of Wildlife Areas and Conservation Activities in Haryana

A comprehensive presentation was made before the Board on Status of Wildlife Areas and Conservation Activities undertaken in Haryana by PCCF (Wildlife) & Chief Wildlife Warden cum Member Secretary, SBWL.

The copy of the presentation is annexed as **Annexure-V**.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board expressed the satisfaction on activities undertaken in the State for management and conservation of wildlife resources and appreciated the initiatives taken by the Department for management and conservation of wildlife. The Board also observed to enhance the financial allocation for management and conservation of wildlife resources in the State.

Agenda Item 8.4: Status of Development of Aravalli Zoo Safari Park

The Board was informed that the Government of Haryana conceptualized a project of Aravalli Zoo Safari Park in an area of 10,000 acres in Gurugram–Nuh districts as a major zoo-safari and eco-tourism project. Initially, the project was to be implemented by the Tourism Department, but now it has been decided that the

project will be implemented by the Forest & Wildlife Department. Central Zoo Authority (CZA) has issued a Feasibility Report for approximately 3,300 acres in Phase-I.

A Transaction Adviser, M/s Primus Partners Pvt. Ltd., has been engaged for preparation of the Detailed Project Report (DPR) and Request for Proposal (RFP) documents, and work thereon is in progress.

The Board was further apprised that I.A. Nos. 244339 and 244340 of 2025 in W.P.(C) No. 202 of 1995 (Dr R.P. Balwan & Others vs State of Haryana & Others) are pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Vide order dated 08.10.2025, Hon'ble Supreme Court has directed that the State shall not take further steps for establishment of the Aravalli Zoo Safari Project till pronouncement of order in I.A. No. 20650 of 2023. Since the Hon'ble Court has pronounced the order in the said IA on 17.11.2025, therefore, the State has requested the Assistant Advocate General, Haryana, to move an application before the Hon'ble Supreme Court for early listing the matter and seeking vacation/clarification of the stay.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board expressed its satisfaction on the progress made by the Department for development of Aravalli Zoo Safari Park and Hon'ble Chairman, SBWL desired that matter should be taken up before the Hon'ble Court on priority.

Agenda Item 8.5: Upgradation and Modernization of Zoos

The Board was informed that Haryana has three Mini Zoos at Pipli (Kurukshetra), Rohtak and Bhiwani, which require upgradation and modernization to meet evolving CZA norms and to improve animal welfare, conservation education and visitor facilities. There is need to align the zoos with national zoo standards to enhance conservation outcomes and visitor management.

The Board was informed that a proposal amounting to Rs. 63.68 crore for modernization of Pipli Zoo, along with revised Master Layout Plan, has been sent to the Urban Local Bodies Department, Haryana and Kurukshetra Development Board. Revised Master Layout Plans for modernization of Rohtak and Bhiwani Zoos are being submitted to Central Zoo Authority, Government of India.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board appreciated the initiative undertaken by the Department for modernization of the Zoos in the State for public awareness. Hon'ble Chief Minister desired that other than the support as requested with Urban Local Bodies, Department and Kurukshetra Development Board, resources through CSR support and other resources be also explored.

Agenda Item 8.6: Formulation of Haryana Wildlife & Nature Conservation Foundation (HWNCF)

The Board was apprised that increasing human-wildlife conflict, rapid urbanisation and biodiversity loss necessitate a flexible and professionally managed institutional mechanism capable of mobilising CSR and external funds for wildlife management and conservation in the State.

The Board was informed that the Haryana Wildlife and Nature Conservation Foundation has been registered as a Society vide No. 00637 dated 28.08.2025 under the Haryana Registration and Regulation of Societies Act, 2012 with the approval of the Government as an autonomous, not-for-profit entity.

The objectives of the Foundation include strengthening wildlife and habitat conservation, promoting eco-tourism and eco-development, enhancing zoo and rescue-centre management, and implementing innovative programmes such as species recovery, vulture conservation and geospatial surveillance.

Initial financial support will be provided by Forest & Wildlife Department, and subsequently the Foundation will mobilise resources from State grants, CSR,

Central schemes, bilateral/multilateral donors, public donations, zoo ticket revenue and conservation plans.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board took note of the registration and objectives of the Foundation and approved the initiative in principle, recognising its potential for enhanced conservation impact through professional management and diversified resource mobilisation. Initial support to the Foundation may be provided by the Forest and Wildlife Department, Haryana and mobilization of resources through State Government grants, CSR funding from corporate entities, Corporate Environment Responsibility, Central Government schemes, Bilateral/multilateral donor agencies, Public donations and project-based financing, Zoo/Parks Ticket Revenue, adoption of zoo animals, funds received through Conservation Plans etc. The details of funds deposited and activities undertaken from the funds of Foundation shall be presented in the meetings of SBWL.

Agenda Item 8.7: Status of Honorary Wildlife Wardens

The Board was informed that Section 4(1)(bb) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 provides for appointment of Honorary Wildlife Wardens to ensure people's participation and community support for wildlife conservation. The applications were invited by the Forest & Wildlife Department through advertisements in English and Hindi newspapers. The applications have been received from across the State. A Committee comprising of (i) PCCF (Wildlife) & CWLW, Haryana (Chairman), (ii) CCF (Wildlife), Panchkula, and (iii) CCF (Wildlife), Gurugram was constituted vide order dated 10.09.2025 to scrutinise applications. The Committee examined the credentials and documents submitted and recommended names for nomination as Honorary Wildlife Wardens for a period of two years.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board approved the recommendations of the Committee for nomination/appointment of the proposed Honorary Wildlife Wardens for a period of two years.

Agenda Item 8.8: Issuance of NOCs for Gun Licences under Section 34(3) of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972

The Board was informed that, in terms of Section 34(3) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, no new licence under the Arms Act, 1959 shall be granted within a radius of 10 km of a Sanctuary without prior concurrence of the Chief Wildlife Warden. Over the last seven years, the Chief Wildlife Warden, Haryana has issued a total of 117 NOCs for grant of gun licences to applicants in different districts within the prescribed radius of Sanctuaries, after due examination. The district-wise break-up of NOCs issued was placed before the Board (Rewari – 4; Panchkula – 3; Kurukshetra – 18; Yamuna Nagar – 49; Gurugram – 43).

Resolution of the Board:

The Board took note of the NOCs issued by the Chief Wildlife Warden and of compliance with statutory requirements under the Wildlife (Protection) Act while granting concurrence.

Agenda Item 8.9: Status of Community Reserves

The Board was informed that there is provision of declaration of any private or community land as Community Reserves having significance for wildlife as per Section 36C of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. The Board was informed that several Community Reserves have been notified in the State on the initiative of Gram Panchayats as mentioned under:

Resolution of the Board:

The Board took note of the current status of the above Community Reserves and appreciated the role of local communities and Panchayats in promoting wildlife conservation outside National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries. Hon'ble Chairman, SBWL directed to explore to identify more areas and get these notified as Community Reserves which are of wildlife significance in the State and encourage communities in management and conservation of wildlife.

Agenda Item 8.10: Human Resources in Wildlife Wing

A note on existing human resources, vacancies and increasing workload in the Wildlife Wing was placed before the Board, highlighting acute staff shortage of staff at various levels. It was informed that requisitions for filling 8 posts of Inspector (Wildlife), 47 posts of Wildlife Guard, 3 posts of Driver, 3 posts of Clerk

and 1 post of Tubewell Operator were sent to HSSC in 2021 and 2024, but no advertisement has been issued so far.

The Board was apprised that human–animal conflict and rescue operations have increased significantly and that additional support staff, especially drivers and field support, are essential; a proposal for cadre revision is under consideration. In view of urgency, it was proposed to deploy additional human resources through Haryana Kaushal Rozgar Nigam Ltd. (HKRNL) – including Computer Operators, Drivers, Ticket Clerk, Receptionist and Group-D – as per minimum requirements indicated.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board noted the acute manpower shortage in the Wildlife Wing and Forest Department and approved deployment of the proposed additional staff through HKRNL on contractual basis, with expenditure to be met from existing budget provisions, till cadre revision is finalised and regular posts are filled. Hon’ble Chiarman, SBWL also directed that the requirement of staff through HKRNL may be reviewed regularly.

Agenda Item 8.11: Development of Water Body and Biodiversity Park at Saraswati Conservation Reserve

A proposal for development of a water body/wetland for wildlife and biodiversity conservation and promotion of eco-tourism in Saraswati Conservation Reserve, District Kurukshetra was placed before the Board. It was informed that the Hon’ble Chief Minister laid the foundation stone of the proposed water body (सरस्वतीआर्द्रभूमिजलाशय), Saraswati Biodiversity Conservation and Ecotourism Vihar (सरस्वती जैव विविधता संरक्षण एवं पर्यावरण पर्यटन विहार), सरस्वती जैव विविधता वाटिका at Sarswati Conservation Reserve on 10.08.2025 during Van Mahotsava celebrations.

The Board was informed that Haryana Water Resources Authority, Panchkula has accorded in-principle approval of Rs. 493.68 lakh for development of the water body. The work shall commence after deposition of funds by HWRA.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board took note of the in-principle financial approval and proposed activities for wetland and biodiversity development initiated in Saraswati Conservation Reserve.

Agenda Item 8.12: Proposal of setting up of Retirement Housing Policy over an area of 2.775 acres (11,230.037 sqm) with total built-up area of 45,883.212 sqm (G+19; height 60.30 m) at Village Dhoraka, Sector-95, Tehsil Harsaru, District Gurugram (M/s AI Buildcon Pvt. Ltd.) in Eco-Sensitive Zone of Sultanpur National Park

A proposal received from M/s AI Buildcon Pvt. Ltd. for setting up a Group Housing Colony under the Retirement Housing Policy over an area of 2.775 acres (11,230.037 sqm) with total built-up area of 45,883.212 sqm (G+19; height 60.30 m) at Village Dhoraka, Sector-95, Tehsil Harsaru, District Gurugram was put up before the Board for approval.

The site is located 4.46 km from the boundary of Sultanpur National Park within its Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ); the built-up area exceeds 20,000 sqm, thus requiring Environmental Clearance and approval of the Standing Committee of NBWL as per MoEFCC guidelines dated 19.12.2012. The total project cost is Rs. 72.11865 crore; the project proponent has submitted a Conservation Plan of Rs. 145 lakhs for habitat management and biodiversity conservation for Schedule I & II species in the 10 km buffer zone. It was also noted that the Zonal Master Plan of ESZ of Sultanpur National Park (Gazette Notification dated 18.06.2021) prohibits

new commercial construction within 3 km of the National Park boundary, with limited exceptions; beyond 3 km, NBWL approval is still required for large projects.

Resolution of the Board:

In view of the decision of the Standing Committee of NBWL linking ESZ-area clearances to action against existing ESZ violations and the pending ATR on such violations from Deputy Commissioner, Gurugram, the Board decided that the proposal shall remain pending and will be reconsidered only after receipt and examination of the ATR, prior to any reference to NBWL. Once action taken report is submitted, the proposal shall be submitted by PCCF (Wildlife) cum Member Secretary, SBWL for approval Hon'ble Chief Minister as Chairman SBWL.

Agenda Item 8.13: setting up a Group Housing Colony under the Retirement Housing Policy over an area of 2.1125 acres (8,548.995 sqm) with total built-up area of 30,387.20 sqm (G+21; height 77 m) at Village Wazirpur, Sector-95, District Gurugram in Eco-Sensitive Zone of Sultanpur National Park

A proposal received from M/s Trehan Promoters & Builders Pvt. Ltd. for setting up a Group Housing Colony under the Retirement Housing Policy over an area of 2.1125 acres (8,548.995 sqm) with total built-up area of 30,387.20 sqm (G+21; height 77 m) at Village Wazirpur, Sector-95, District Gurugram was placed before the Board for approval.

The project site is located 3.9 km from the boundary of Sultanpur National Park within its ESZ; the built-up area being more than 20,000 sqm, the project requires Environmental Clearance and approval of SC-NBWL as per MoEFCC guidelines dated 19.12.2012. The total project cost is Rs. 50.7372 crore; the project proponent has submitted a Conservation Plan of Rs. 102 lakhs for Schedule I & II species in the 10 km buffer zone.

Resolution of the Board:

Considering the same regulatory context and the pending ATR on ESZ violations referred to under Agenda 8.12, the Board decided that this proposal shall also remain pending and will be reconsidered only after receipt of the ATR from Deputy Commissioner, Gurugram, before any reference is made to NBWL. Once action taken report is submitted, the proposal shall be submitted by PCCF (Wildlife) cum Member Secretary, SBWL for approval Hon'ble Chief Minister as Chairman SBWL.

Agenda Item 8.14: Construction of Bridge on Pathrala River (Village Kansli–Village Chikan), Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary

A proposal for construction of a bridge on Pathrala River to connect Village Kansli with Village Chikan in District Yamuna Nagar, in pursuance of CM Announcement No. 26414 dated 15.05.2022, was placed before the Board. The site falls within Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary and requires diversion of 0.32 ha of Sanctuary land; total project cost is Rs. 805.93 lakh, and the user agency has submitted a Conservation Plan of Rs. 16.12 lakh (2% of project cost) as per MoEF&CC guidelines dated 24.02.2023. A detailed ecological impact report has been obtained from Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Dehradun, outlining potential impacts and recommended mitigation measures.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board noted the public-interest nature of the connectivity project and the ecological sensitivity of Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary. It was decided that a meeting shall be convened between officials of the Irrigation Department, Wildlife Department Haryana and Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun to discuss the WII report and finalise appropriate design of the bridge

considering conservation measures, before a final decision is taken and the case is processed for recommendation to NBWL.

Agenda Item 8.15: Establishment of Deer Park at Village Hassanpur, District Karnal

A proposal for establishment of a Deer Park at Village Hassanpur, Tehsil Gharaunda, District Karnal, based on request of Hon'ble Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha, was placed before the Board. The proposal was examined in a meeting under the chairmanship of Additional Chief Secretary (Environment, Forest & Wildlife) on 05.08.2025, wherein requirement of Rs. 12.77 crore was projected for inclusion in the Supplementary Budget for 2025-26.

Resolution of the Board:

The Board took note of the proposal and agreed in principle to establishment of the Deer Park at Hassanpur, District Karnal, and endorsed that the matter be taken up with the Finance Department for provision of the required budget in the Supplementary Budget 2025-26.

Agenda Item 8.16: Special Activities during 2025 Related to Wildlife Awareness and Conservation

The Board was apprised of special activities undertaken during the year 2025 by the Wildlife Wing as described under:

- Asian Water Birds Count – January 04, 2025 at Sultanpur National Park
- World Wetland Day – Feb 02, 2025 at Sultanpur National Park
- World Wildlife Day – March 03, 2025 at Jhabua, Bawal, Rewari


