Constitution of India

No.RTR.1075/6610/PH-2-(B). In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India and in supersession of all existing rules, orders or instruments made in this behalf and in force in the State or any part thereof, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment to the post of Deputy Director of Health Services, Class-I, in the Maharashtra Medical and Health Services, namely:-

1. These rules may be called the Deputy Director of Health Services (Recruitment) Rules 1981.

2. In the rules, unless the context required otherwise.

(a) "Commission" means the Maharashtra Public Service Commission.,

(b) "Degree" means a degree of a Statutory University.,

(c) "Diploma" means a diploma of a Statutory University.,

(d) "Government" means the Government of Maharashtra;

(e) "Medical Council of India" means the Medical Council of India constituted under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

3. Appointments to the post of Deputy Director of Health Services in charge of Circles, Headquarters, Civil Defence, Leprosy, Tuberculosis and B.C.G. shall be made either.-

:2:

(a) by promotion of suitable officers in the Maharashtra Medical and Health Services, Class-I, having not less than 4 years continuous service in that cadre; or

(b) by transfer of suitable officers in other Services possessing the qualifications and experience prescribed for appointment by nomination in clause (c) of this rule; or

(c) by nomination from amongst candidates who-

(i) unless already in the service of the Government, are not more than 45 years of age;

(ii) possess M.B.B.S. degree of a statutory University or any other qualification specified in the first or second Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956;

(iii) possess a post-graduate degree or a post-graduate diploma in any of the qualifications specified in the first or second Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956, or any other qualification recognised as equivalent thereto by the Medical Council of India; and

(iv) possess experience of health administration, medical relief or family welfare under Government, Zilla Parishad or a Local Body for not less than 5 years in the case of those holding post-graduate degree and for not less than 7 years in the case of those holding post-graduate diploma, gained after acquiring the post-graduate diploma, or or post-graduate degree, as the case may be, and out of which experienced for 4 years shall be in a Class-I post or in a post equivalent thereto;

Provided that, the age limit may be relaxed by Government on the recommendation of the Commission in favour of candidates having exceptional qualifications or experience or both.

4. Appointment to the posts by promotion and nomination shall be made in the ratio of 50:50.

5. A person appointed to the post by nomination shall be on probation for a period of two years.

6. A person appointed to the post, whether by promotion, transfer or nomination, shall be required to pass examination in Hindi and Marathi according to the rules made in that behalf, unless he has already passed, or has been exempted from passing, those examinations.

7. A person appointed to the post shall, if so required, be liable to serve in any Defence Service of India or a post connected with the defence of India, anywhere in or outside India, for a period of not less than four years (inclusive of the period spent on training, if any) on such conditions as may be determined from time to time by the Government of India,

Provided that such person shall not be required to serve as aforesaid after the expiry of ten years from the date of his appointment or ordinarily after he has attained the age of forty-five years.

8. A person selected for appointment to the post shall be required to get himself registered under the Maharashtra Medical Council Act, 1965, before joining the post unless he has already so registered or his name is borne on the Indian Medical Register maintained under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.
