No. RTR 1075/1095/CR-32/SER-I. - In

exercise of powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment to the post of Deputy Director of Health Services (Public Health Laboratories) General State Service, Class-I in the Directorate of Health Services of the Government of Maharashtra, namely :-

1. These rules may be called the Deputy Director of Health Services (Public Health Laboratories), General State Service, Class-I, in the Directorate of Health Services of the Government of Maharashtra (Recruitment) Rules, 1985.

2. In these rules, unless the context requires otherwise:

- a) "Commission" means Maharashtra Public Service Commission;
- b) "degree" means a degree of a statutory University;
- c) "Directorate" means the Directorate of Health Services of the Government of Maharashtra;
- d) "Government" means the Government of Maharashtra.

3. Appointment to the post of Deputy Director of Health Services (Public Health Laboratories)

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shall be made either, -

a) by promotion of a suitable person on the basis of selection from amongst the person holding the posts of Chief Technical Officer, Public Health Laboratory or Officer-in-charge, Regional Public Health Laboratory in the Directorate and possessing the qualifications and experience prescribed for appointment by nomination in clause (c); or

b) by transfer of a suitable Class - Officer from any other Department of the Government possessing the qualifications and experience prescribed for appointment by nomination in clause (c); or

c) by nomination from amongst candidates who, -

i) unless already in the service of Government are not more than forty years of age;

ii) possess post-graduate degree in Biochemistry, Inorganic chemistry, Organic Chemistry, Chemistry of Foods, Drugs and Water or Food Technology or an equivalent qualification; and

iii) possess experience for a period of not less than 10 years gained after acquiring the qualification mentioned in sub-clause (ii) in analysis of food, knowledge of food standards and their composition, water and effluent analysis, knowledge of water and effluent standards and problems connected with environmental pollution;

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Provided that the age-limit may be relaxed by Government on the recommendation of the Commission in favour of candidates having exceptional qualifications or experience or both:

Provided further that preference may be given to candidates having research experience in food and water Chemistry and Microbiology as evidenced by published papers.

4. A person appointed to the post by nomination shall be on probation for a period of 2 years.

5. A person appointed to the post, whether by promotion, transfer or nomination, shall be required to pass examinations in Marathi and Hindi according to the rules made in that behalf, unless he has already passed, or has been exempted from passing, these examinations.
