## **Significant Activities at a Glance 2025-26**

### **Regional Principals' Conference (17–19 June 2025)**

The 3-day Principals' Conference chaired by Shri Dharmendra Patle, Deputy Commissioner, KVS, RO, Bengaluru was conducted from 17<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> June 202. It emphasized academic excellence and collaborative leadership. Principals deliberated on CBSE results, Performance Indicators, and strategies for 2025–26. The inaugural featured Guard of Honour, lamp lighting, cultural performance, and felicitation. The event concluded with collective resolve for progressive institutional growth.

### **Bharat Scout & Guide Divisional Association Meeting (11 July 2025)**

Bharat Scout & Guide Divisional Association Meeting was held on 11<sup>th</sup> July 2025. It was presided by Shri R Pramod, Assistant Commissioner, KVS, RO, Bengaluru, the meeting gathered 18 dignitaries including Scouts & Guides District Commissioners. Key discussions focused on reviewing the previous year's budget and planning forthcoming camps. The Chief Guest highlighted the Scouts & Guides' role in discipline and service. ### **One-Day Rajbhasha Workshop (22 September 2025)**

## Report on CPD Sessions Held at PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya MEG and Centre(2025–26)

The academic year 2025–26 at Kendriya Vidyalaya MEG and Centre featured a well-planned series of CPD sessions aimed at strengthening teachers' professional competence. The first session of the year, held on **13 March 2025**, focused on UBI Training and was conducted by Neha P. This was followed on **29 March 2025** by the *Roopantar* programme led by Nirmala J, which highlighted pedagogical transformation and effective classroom processes.



On **30 April 2025**, the Principal conducted a workshop on strategies for academic improvement, offering guidance on effective teaching practices and ways to enhance student performance. The focus shifted to service rules and responsibilities on **5 July 2025**, when the Principal led a session on CCS Rules along with the duties of class teachers, emphasising student safety and security.

Teachers attended a practical session on the use of the interactive panel on **17 July 2025**, delivered by Samsung personnel, enabling them to integrate technology more effectively in the teaching–learning process. Later, on **26 July 2025**, another detailed session on CCS Rules was conducted by Ranjana P, reinforcing teachers' understanding of service norms and procedures.

A session on portfolios as a tool for assessment was organised on **26 July 2025**, with resource person Nirmala.J guiding teachers on the role of portfolios in documenting student learning. Digital competency was further strengthened on **15 September 2025** through Adobe Training by Sumitha, supporting teachers in creating digital learning materials. The next day, **16 September 2025**, a session on Stress Management was conducted by SP Verma, Ex-Principal, helping teachers manage professional challenges effectively.



On **16 October 2025**, a combined session on Learner's Diary, Portfolio, and MDP was taken up by Deepa N and Nirmala J, enhancing teachers' skills in record maintenance and reflective documentation. This was followed by an important session on **30 October 2025**, where Monica M conducted training on nurturing adolescents' mental health and well-being.

Technology integration continued to be prioritised with a session on the Use of ICT in Teaching-Learning, held on **31 October 2025** by Sreelakshmi AP. On **4 November 2025**, representatives from each department presented their subject-wise best practices, offering valuable opportunities for cross-learning and departmental collaboration.



Inclusive Education was addressed on **7 November 2025** by Nirmala J, emphasising support for diverse learners. Towards the end of the year, multiple sessions on CCS Conduct Rules were conducted by the Principal on **15 November 2025**, **17 November 2025**, and **19 November 2025**, ensuring that all teachers were fully aware of ethical standards, duties, and professional expectations.
