### ORDER

The Government of India, Ministry of Education, New Delhi  
 have proposed to start a few schools in each State under the  
 Central Schools Scheme. The Central Schools are meant mainly to  
 cater to the needs of children of Central Government Employees  
 members of All India Services, liable to transfer. The schools  
 residential in character, have common medium of instruction  
 in Hindi/English, common courses of studies and common examination  
 the Central Board of Secondary Education. Though priority is  
 given to children of Central Government employees for admission to  
 Central Schools, a certain percentage of seats will be earmarked  
 for other students also. Each Central School will be administered  
 by a Committee in accordance with the rules and regulations framed  
 by the Ministry of Education in this behalf from time to time.

The Government of India have agreed to establish a Central  
 School at Trivandrum from the coming academic year. The State  
 Government have to provide a suitable site for the purpose, free  
 of cost. All items of expenditure, recurring as well as non-  
 recurring except provision of site will be met by the Government  
 of India.

The State Government accept the proposal of the Government of  
 India to establish a Central School at Trivandrum. The school will  
 be located in the Thulasi Hill Compound, Pattom. Five acres of  
 land from the Thulasi Hill compound will be made available to the  
 Government of India free of cost for the establishment of the school.

The School will be administered by the Committee which will be  
 constituted shortly. The Director of Public Instruction is requested  
 to submit proposals immediately in this behalf on the basis of the  
 instructions from the Government of India.

The site earmarked for the school will be placed immediately  
 at the disposal of the Director of Public Instruction. The school  
 is programmed to start functioning from the 24th of June 1964  
 with classes VI to IX with English as medium. Till permanent build-  
 ings are constructed the school will be conducted in temporary sheds  
 set up for the purposes. The executive engineer (Buildings and Road  
 Trivandrum, will take immediate steps for the construction of the  
 temporary structures required in consultation with the Director of  
 Public Instruction so that the school can be started in June 1964  
 itself as programmed by the Government of India. The Chief Engineer  
 (Building and roads) will issue necessary instructions to the  
 Executive Engineer in this regard. All further steps in regard to
