REPORT

The 54th National Sports Meet for Swimming and Diving (Boys and Girls) got off to a rousing start at the ASC Centre (S) Swimming Pool at Bengaluru, hosted by the Venue Vidyalaya PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya, Bengaluru on the 2nd of August, 2025.

The day started with a welcome to the visiting dignitaries who graced the occasion and inaugurated the event. A colourful cultural programme of dances set the mood for the occasion.

Brig. Rohit Sethi, Chairman of the Vidyalaya and the Chief Guest of the event, declared the Meet open. He was accompanied by Lt. Col. A. Chibber, Nominee Chairman, Jitendra Naik TMO and Major T.B. Thapa, PTO at ASC Centre(S).

Shri Shaik Tajuddin, newly joined Deputy Commissioner of KVS, Bengaluru Region, graced the occasion as the Guest of Honour. He was accompanied by Shri Anil Kumar, Principal PM SHRI KV Malleswaram. The events for the day included 800 mtrs.Freestyle,50mtr.Butterfly Stroke, 100 mtr Individual Medley, Diving etc. for both girls and boys.

With the arrival of a slightly overcast Day 2 of the Meet, it commenced with continuation of the swimming events at the pool. In the morning, an ever-involved Major T.B. Thapa, PTO at ASC Centre(S), paid a quick visit to the Pool, to oversee the events. The highlights of the day included Individual Medleys, Relay Races and a few individual events.

Day Three of the 54th NSM dawned as another pleasant day of the famed Bangalore weather, with a host of events lined up. Major T.B. Thapa, PTO at ASC Centre(S), paid a quick visit to the Pool, to check on the arrangements and oversee the events. The venue continued to play host to another set of visiting dignitaries. It was led by Shri Manoj Pandey, Assistant Commissioner (IT and Sports Cell), KVS Head Quarters, accompanied by Shri R. Pramod, Smt. Hema K., Shri R.M. Day Four of the Meet dawned as a wet, pleasant day, with the events half-way through to the total number of competitions, but the wet weather did nothing to dampen the spirits of the participants. Besides the PET of the host Vidyalaya, Mrs. Bharti Kumari, the admirable and diligent team of ASC Centre swimming officials led by Mr. Santanu and Mr. Sam, continued with the job at hand in a professional manner.

The day continued to see the untiring efforts of the champion swimmers as they competed with each other and even with themselves, as they strove to better their own records. It concluded with an elaborate medal ceremony which honoured and acknowledged the efforts of the cream of the champion swimmers. With the best to come on the final day - the 6th of August, 2025, the penultimate day's events proved to be a befitting precursor to the final edition. With palpable excitement for the final day and in anticipation of the Championship Trophies, the sports stars retired for the day, heading back to the Vidyalaya for a colourful cultural programme.

The final day of the NSM was a culmination of the efforts of the champion swimmers and divers of various regions from all over the country as they played along, with emotions running high in every competitor's mind. It was a day of the untiring efforts of the swimmers, a day of final selection for the SGFI and of talent-spotting from the selected batch of school kids.

To honour their efforts, medals and certificates were handed over to them by the visiting dignitaries comprising of top officials of the Army Centre and the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Regional Office, Bengaluru during the Valedictory function in the afternoon. The gathering was honoured by the presence of Col.Sanjeev Singh Jamwal, Veer Chakra and Dy. Commandant at ASC Centre (S), who was accompanied by the illustrious Col. Jitendra Naik, TMO, besides the Nominee Chairman, Lt. Col. Ankush Chibber and Major T.B.Thapa, PTO, all serving at ASC Centre (S). Bengaluru Region was represented by Mrs. Hema K., Assistant Commissioner

and Mrs. Bhagylaksmi, the Incharge Principal of the Vidyalaya.
