Lakshmi Mazumdar

Lakshmi Mazumdar was the Former National Commissioner of the Bharat Scouts and Guides from November 1964 to April 1983, (18 Years) and supervised the construction of the Sangam World Center, which was inaugurated on 16 October 1966 by the World Chief Guide, Lady Olave Baden-Powell.

Lakshmi Mazumdar joined Guiding at a very young age in 1922. After independence, she held high responsibilities and thrived to make The Bharat Scouts and Guides a leading and vibrant organisation. In 1969 Mazumdar was awarded the Bronze Wolf, the only distinction of the World Organization of the Scout Movement, awarded by the World Scout Committee for exceptional services to world Scouting. She was a recipient of the Padma Shri in 1965.

PURPOSE	 To recognized the Outstanding Involvement in the Community for A Community Service or Community Development Project organized by the Registered Units of the Bharat Scouts and Guides in the locality. A long term / Short term Project A small or a large Project within the country/State. 		
NOMINATION	Nomination to be sent on the prescribed format along with relevant supported documents by District Chief Commissioner through State Chief Commissioner.		
PERIOD	One Year (1 st August to 31 st July every year)		
ELIGIBILITY	One entry from each section of both the wings separately i.e. Scout, Guide, Rover and Ranger.		
LAST DATE OF NOMINATION	31 st August at N.H.Q.		
AWARDED TO	Scout Troop, Guide Company, Rover Crew and Ranger Team.		
LOG BOOK	Log Book must be prepared and submitted to N.H.Q. by 30th Sept. Log Book must contains the detailed month wise report of activities, participants list, photographs, in action newspaper cutting if any, work recognized by any authorities.		
SELECTION	On the recommendation of DCC through SCC, a panel of 5 judges at N.H.Q. will declared the name of Award Winning Units.		
JUDGING	By Committee of 5 Judges appointed by the Chief National Commissioner.		
RECOGNITION	 A Certificate will be presented to the winning Group/Unit from each section which will be presented to the State Association in the National Council Meeting. Unit Leaders and participants of the winning units will receive the certificate signed by the Chief National Commissioner A Certificate of participation will be awarded to each group entry in tribute to the outstanding service.
