# **Proposed Vidyalaya Plan- PART B (under PM Shree Schools):**

# 1. Curriculum, Pedagogy and Assessment

(A) Support at Pre-School Education / Bal-Vatika (ECCE)

- (i) Introduction of Balvatika in our Vidyalaya as pilot project started from Oct 2022 .
- (ii) Adequate facilities for drinking water, separate toilets for boys and girls (at least two) to be made available at Balvatika according to their size and age.
- (iii) Blackboards to be stretched across the length of the classroom's four walls and replace the traditional blackboard. On one wall, calendars to be painted with a black grid wherein children can perform their activities. The border along the calendar to be used to depict the seasons.
- (iv) Child zones/learning corners or activity rooms separate from classrooms to be built that allows students to pick from a range of carefully picked educational indigenous toys, making learning systematic and fun.
- (v) Separate Library for Balvatika Students to be developed so that the Love for reading could be developed in students through interesting, colourful books, narratives and interactive discussions.
- (vi) The library hour can be made more interesting with story-telling sessions by showing them stories with the help of Smart interactive Boards. An activity room for Balvatika students well equipped with Tech gadgets including smart interactive panels ,Audio Visual presenters to be made available.
- (vii) A beautiful Play way site outdoors including swings specially meant for small kids of 3 to 6 years is required to keeps them fit, and at the same time help with gross motor skills and hand-eye coordination as well. Swings can also be placed in that space for students to enjoy with their peers.

# (B) Teaching Learning Material for Primary Schools

## TLM / Supplimentary Materials for Class I-V

- (i) Vidyalaya needs Supplementary TLM for acquiring various skills and competencies in cognitive as well as other domains like Toys, Puzzles, puppets, games, board games, Story books, anecdotes, jokes, local rhymes, local folk songs/lore, art and craft, online access, flashcards, picture books, play dough, building blocks, music and movement, dramatic play etc.
- (ii) Teachers will use visuals in the activity classroom well equipped with electronic gadgets including smart boards and projectors that use large images to reinforce key concepts and colours that stimulate mental activity using online educational apps designed for the said purpose.

- (iii) Nature trips will be organized to have a strong effect on learning and overall memory. Schools may ensure the availability of building block play areas.
- (iv) Separate library for the students can be made available including books relevant to overall curriculum and manipulative such as base ten blocks, pattern blocks and geometric shapes can be used to make the student visualize and understand the abstract concepts in a concrete way.
- (v) Science kits: Science kits can be used to teach different science concepts such as the human body, weather, and ecosystems. They often contain materials and equipment that students can use to conduct experiments and learn through handson experience.
- (vi) Maps and globes: Maps and globes can be used to teach geography and social studies. They help students to understand different regions, countries, and cultures, and develop their spatial reasoning skills.
- (vii) Vidyalaya will organize cultural exchange programmes so that the students are encouraged to visit different communities and identify indigenous settlements in their own city/town. Students will also visit places of historical and cultural significance, archaeological sites and learn about local.

## (C) Learning Enhancement Programme (LEP) / Remedial Teaching

Classroom based interventions focusing on enhancing the students' learning capacities – that is, activity-based and hands- on experiential/art-integrated/sport-integrated learning to acquire listed learning outcomes. Here, teachers are expected to record individual Student Academic Progress to be able to identify areas of improvement from time to time. The following activities will be covered under this:

- (i) Conduct workshops on various topics such as science, technology, engineering, mathematics, arts, and humanities.
- (ii) Organize career guidance seminars and counseling sessions to help students identify their career interests and aspirations.
- (iii) Host guest lectures and talks by subject matter experts, professionals, and industry leaders.
- (iv) Set up a well-equipped library with books, magazines, and digital resources for students to access.
- (v) Implement a teacher training program to enhance the teaching skills and pedagogy of educators.
- (vi) Provide scholarships and financial aid to deserving students to support their education.
- (vii) Establish a mentorship program that pairs students with mentors who can offer guidance and support.
- (viii) Develop and implement a peer tutoring program to encourage students to help each other with their studies.
- (ix) Offer extracurricular activities such as sports, music, drama, and dance to promote holistic development.

- (x) Develop and implement an experiential learning program that allows students to learn by doing.
- (xi) Organize educational trips and field visits to museums, science centers, and historical sites.
- (x) Invest in technology such as interactive whiteboards, tablets, and laptops to facilitate digital learning.
- (xi) Create a maker space or innovation lab that provides students with hands-on learning opportunities.
- (xii) Organize competitions such as science fairs, debates, and quiz contests to promote healthy competition and intellectual growth.
- (xiii) Develop and implement a social responsibility program that encourages students to participate in community service and volunteer work.
- (xiv) Offer short term training programs such as coding, robotics, and 3D printing to equip students with relevant skills for the future job market.
- (xv) Establish a student-led newspaper, radio station, or podcast to foster communication and media skills.
- (xvi) Provide counseling and mental health services to support students' emotional and mental well-being.
- (xvii) Create a parent-teacher association that allows parents to be involved in their children's education and school activities.
- (xviii) Hands on practice on implementing AI projects in the domain of Computer Vision, Natural Language Processing and Data Science. Various sensors like temperature, humidity etc are required to collect data and integrate with AI project.
- (xix) Individualized learning interventions for children with special needs, and identified slow learners, especially with the help of special educators, therapists, peer learning, parental/volunteer involvement, etc.
- (xx) Academic enrichment beyond classroom to be brought by introducing project based Science Circles, Math Circles, Music & Dance Performance Circles, Chess Circles, Poetry Circles, Language Circles, Drama Circles, Debate Circles, Sports Circles, Eco- Clubs, Photography clubs, Social-service clubs, Digital clubs, Heritage clubs, Literary clubs, Art clubs, Health & Well-being Clubs/ Yoga Clubs and so on.

## (D) Competency Based Assessment

The following competencies will be assessed:

- (i) Literacy: The ability to read, write, and communicate effectively.
- (ii) Numeracy: The ability to understand and work with numbers and mathematical concepts.
- (iii) Critical thinking: The ability to analyze information, draw conclusions, and solve problems.
- (iv) Creativity: The ability to generate new ideas, approaches, and solutions.

- (v) Collaboration: The ability to work effectively with others, both in-person and remotely.
- (vi) Digital literacy: The ability to use technology and digital tools effectively.
- (vii) Cultural competence: The ability to understand and appreciate different cultures and perspectives.
- (viii) Emotional intelligence: The ability to understand and manage one's own emotions, as well as the emotions of others.
- (ix) Civic engagement: The ability to understand and participate in the democratic process.

The tools to be used are rubrics, performance tasks, self assessment, peer assessment, portfolios. The possibility to use commercially available tools for Competency Based Assessment like MasteryConnect, Formative, FreshGrade, Chalk and Edmentum etc will also be explored.

# (E) Holistic Report Cards

- (i) Holistic, 360-degree, multi-dimensional report showing progress/ uniqueness of each learner in the cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains will be planned and developed.
- (ii) The possibility to use commercially available tools like PowerSchool, Skooly, Alma etc will also be explored.
- (iii) The online sharing of holistic report card between parents and teachers will enhance further progress in the learning domains of students.

## (F) School Readiness Modules

- (i) Print rich classroom environments will be created in the form of word walls, story books, posters to assist in development of print awareness and literacy skills.
- (ii) Indigenous/ locally available material will be used which is low cost or no-cost and easily accessible. Make sure children can manipulate the material and have safe accessibility to the material and other resources.
- (iii) Competency based assessment will be used to assess the students on the skills required for school readiness.

(iv) Training/workshops will be organised for the teachers to develop the school readiness module in alignment with the needs of grade 1.

## (G) Teacher Resource Material / Handbook

- (i) Provision of Teacher Manuals, Activity Handbooks, resource materials for teachers to align their innovative pedagogies with learning outcomes and grade level competencies.
- (ii) Preparation of No-cost, Low-Cost, Do It Yourself (DIY) type TLM by school teachers.

## (H) Rashtriya Aavishkar Abhiyaan

- (i) Vidyalaya will form Science & Mathematics Teacher Circles in collaboration with adjoining KVs/other schools in order to promote learning in mathematics and science
- (ii) Students will be encouraged to form Science/Mathematics Clubs with adjoining KVs/other schools in order to promote peer learning
- (iii) Participation of Students in Inter-school, State/National Maths and Science Competitions/ Olympiads etc will be encouraged
- (iv) Educational trips/excursions to Science Museums and Science fairs and Mathematics Melas will be conducted.
- (v) Parents and community will be sensitized to promote innovative and critical thinking in the students. The parents/teacher meetings and community outreach programmes will be conducted.

# (I) Introduction of Vocational Education at Secondary and Sr. Secondary Level

Vocational Education to be introduced as an integral part of general education at Secondary and Senior Secondary level. The vocational subjects are to be introduced as an additional/mandatory subject at the secondary level and as compulsory (elective) at the Senior Secondary level.

(i) Vidyalaya will be conducting vocational education in hospitality and tourism for students with the help of experts hired from this domain.

- (ii) The labs for hospitality and tourism will be constructed to provide experiential learning and hands on training by the students.
- (iii) The students will be given hands on training on providing first aid to handle common emergencies. They will be trained on recording vitals like Temperature, Pulse and Respiration rate.
- (iv) Special emphasis will be given on teaching CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation).
- (v) The medical room will be upgraded for this purpose and will include dummies to practice these medical and first aid skills.

# (J) <u>Library Grant</u>

- (i) Books, magazines and newspapers will be purchased to promote FLN among the students.
- (ii) Enjoyable and inspirational books for students will be purchased in local and Indian languages. Braille and books in accessible formats for CwSN will also be purchased on priority.

# (K) Sports & Physical Education

- (i) Vidyalaya will procure sports equipment for indoor and outdoor games.
- (ii) A provision of multipurpose sports hall including badminton court, table tennis court, chess, carom boards and gymnasium will be made in order to develop fitness as a lifelong skill and attitude.
- (iii) Sports coaches will be hired for this purpose.
- (iv) The sports ground available in the ground will be upgraded.

# (L) <u>Project Innovation</u>

School Specific Projects to create and nurture holistic and well-rounded individuals equipped with key 21st century skills such as critical thinking, creativity, scientific temper, communication, collaboration, multilingualism, problem solving, ethics, social responsibility, and digital literacy.

- (i) The STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) projects will be undertaken by the students at Vidyalaya.
- (ii) The students will be encouraged to acquired basic knowledge required for project completion at home and work on projects in the school time by using collaborative learning.

- (iii) Students will be encouraged to identify a need in the local community and develop a plan to address it.
- (iv) Students will undertake creative writing projects to write short stories, poems or plays that explores different genres and styles of writing.
- (v) Counsellors and special educators will be hired to support students in career guidance, mental health and emotional well-being.
- (vi) Teachers will be trained through workshops for providing joyful and innovative pedagogy.
- (vii) Projects to develop Teaching Leaning Materials support for Balvatika will be undertaken at the Vidyalaya.
- (viii) Publication of school magazine
- (ix) Teachers will be trained to integrate tradition/local knowledge/Lok-Vidya in teaching-learning.
- (x) Local industries will be tied up to provide fundamental knowledge of the industry so that student can innovate to address the existing problems in the industry.

# (M) Access Infrastructure - Adequacy, Functionality, Aesthetics and Safety

#### **Strengthening of Existing Schools (Excluding Pre-Primary)**

Provision for:

- (i) Strengthening activities/infrastructure support to be provided for Balvatika/preprimary sections in Primary School.
- Science and Maths Lab, language lab, Atal tinkering lab in collaboration with Niti Ayog, Computer Room, Art Cultural Room, Library, ACR, Water & Toilet, essential classroom furniture, resource centre (for CwSN) staff room, boundary wall, etc.
- (iii) Upgradation of computer lab: need more computers, power backup for pcs which is an urgent need, installation of softwares required, installation of AR/VR eqpts to give real like experience
- (iv) Smart labs with digital board for better experience of practical of Chemistry Physics and Bio. Each class must have lecture stand and display board
- (v) Major Repair, Minor Repair.
- (vi) Electrification.
- (vii) Energy efficient/ solar power/ adoption of organic lifestyle.
- (viii) Rain water harvesting system.

- (ix) Solar panel.
- (x) Barrier free access throughout the school campus including classrooms, drinking water facilities, toilets, play/sports area, libraries & laboratories etc. The Harmonized Guidelines and Standards for Universal Accessibility in India31 maybe referenced for creating barrier free access in schools.
- (xi) Provision for building Auditorium ,Multipurpose hall for Sports and Canteen and repairing boundary walls

# (N) Green School

Provision for:

- (i) Composting facility (like vermi-composting) for kitchen and garden waste
- (ii) Vegetable /Medical/Kitchen Gardens
- (iii) Drip Irrigation Systems (i.e. made with earther pots or plastic bottles or any other waste material)
- (iv) Colourful sorting dustbins painted in interesting characters for waste segregation
- (v) Covering area of the school with grass or plantation of different varieties
- (vi) Organize 'Swachhta Pakhwada' clean up drives
- (vii) Expert Talks on On topics of importance like sustainable lifestyle.
- (viii) Field Visits on Waste-water treatment plant, a functioning reedbed or compositing toiler, or similar other place and link it with relevant content areas of the curriculum.
- (ix) LED Lightening
- (x) Activity Promoting Green School
  - a. Installation of solar power system at the Vidyalaya
  - b. Installation of incinerator and dust bins for menstrual hygiene management.
  - c. Nutritional garden will be prepared at Vidyalaya premises.
  - d. Vidyalaya will conduct a water audit with the help of students so that they can understand the amount of water consumption and prepare a water efficiency plan.

# (O) Digital Library

Provision of digital libraries comprising tablets with pre-loaded educational content for students of classes upper primary and above.

- (i) Vidyalaya will make tablets accessible to students with preloaded educational contents.
- (ii) Vidyalaya will ensure that ratio of the tablets is appropriate to total enrolled students so that every child could get quality time with the device. The timetable and schedule should be planned accordingly.
- (iii) Vidyalaya will upgrade the content of tablets regularly based on the needs of students so the relevance of the content is maintained.

## (P) ICT and Digital Initiatives

The component will cover classes VI to XII.

- (i) The non-recurring/ recurring grant under 'ICT and Digital Initiatives' for schools will be available for ICT/ smart classrooms/ and adopting futuristic technologies such as- such as- IT, Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, 3-D printing, IOT, technology, Data Analytic, Space Technology, Business Intelligence, Augmented Reality/ Virtual Reality, Cyber Security, Data Science, Robotics, etc.
- (ii) Flexibility to procure hardware such as tablets/ laptops/notebooks/integrated teaching learning devices, assistive devices and open source operating system as well as Hardware, Software, training and resource support. This would include support for digital boards, smart classrooms, virtual classrooms and DTH channels also.

## (Q) Annual School Grant

- (i) School grant on an annual basis for annual maintenance and replacement of nonfunctional school equipment and for incurring other recurring costs, such as consumables, laboratories, electricity charges, internet, water, development of specific teaching aids/tools by school teachers to enhance classroom learning in the school under LEP etc.
- Organisation of Annual function, Awareness camps/ programs/ celebrations of national programmes/ activities.
- (iii) Extracurricular activities such as Summer Camps,
- (iv) Drawing/Dance/Debate competitions, Bagless Days, etc.
- (v) Promote Swach Bharat campaign.

## (R) Transport/Escort facility

- (i) Provision for transport /escort facility up to secondary level for Children in remote habitations with sparse population where opening of schools is unviable or where Gross Access Ratio is low.
- (ii) State would need to notify such habitations and identify the number of children in that habitation who would be provided this facility. This would be appraised based on the data provided by the State for such children under UDISE+.
- (iii) Convergence with Gram Panchayat/Urban Local Bodies/ Municipality for providing transport facility, if any.

## (S) Free uniform and text books

- (i) Free Uniforms (Including Shoes) as per RTE rules for classes I-VIII.
- (ii) Free Textbooks as per RTE rules for classes I-VIII.

# (T) Inclusive Practices and Gender Equity

#### Provision for children with special needs (CWSN)

- (i) A resource room will be created for CwSN which will include the Teaching Learning Material.
- (ii) Special educators, Speech Therapist and Occupational Therapists will be hired.
- (iii) Teachers will be sensitized and trained on handling CwSN.

# (U) <u>Gender Equity</u>

#### Self Defence training for girls

(i) Self defence training for girls: Training for 3 months for inculcating self-defence skills including life skill for self-protection and self-development respectively.

## **Special Equity Projects**

- Special school specific projects for enhancing access, retention and quality such as enrolment drives, retention and motivation camps, awareness camps including programmes on menstrual health & hygiene management, gender sensitization modules, etc.
- Schools will also ensure provision of Sanitary Pads to all girl students aged 12 years and above in convergence with related Departments.

- (iii) Focus on Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDGs)
- (iv) Webinars and online workshops for teachers, principals, administrators, counsellors, and students will be undertaken to sensitize them on social issues and stigmas such as discrimination, segregation of disadvantaged and vulnerable groups, etc

# (V) Management, Monitoring & Governance

#### Child Tracking

- (i) Develop a Progress Tracking and Monitoring Mechanism that may track student progress across the following themes
  - (a) General Student Data
  - (b) Attendance
  - (c) Academic Performance
  - (d) Co-curricular Performance
  - (e) Physical and Mental health indicators

## (W) Beneficiary Satisfaction

- (i) VMC meetings are conducted quarterly.
- (ii) PTA/PTM are conducted frequently to interact with the parents about the progress of the students

## (X) Human Resources and School Leadership

- (i) Vidyalaya conducts in-service training and workshops for teachers to enhance their professional skills.
- (ii) Vidyalaya conducts Workshops/lectures programmes for creating awareness on RTE act, learning outcomes, holistic report card, school based assessment etc
- (iii) Involvement of community and alumni in volunteer efforts for enhancing learning such as one-to-one tutoring; the teaching of literacy and holding extrahelp sessions; teaching support and guidance for educators; career guidance and mentoring to students etc
