Dear Madam/sir,

Please refer to this department's D.O. letter no 08-03/2022-IS.I3 dated 14th July 2022(copy enclosed) conveying the Lakshyas/Learning Outcomes(L.O) for Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) followed by D.O. letter of even number dated 08th August, 2023(copy enclosed) vide which, it was communicated that henceforth NIPUN Bharat Mission is modified in terms of coverage to -"3 to 8 years of age covering 3 years of pre-school education and Grade 1 and 2" and Grade 3 will be part of the Preparatory stage in Samagra Shiksha which is Grade 3, 4 and 5.

2. In this connection, the National Curriculum Framework(NCF) was released in October 2022. The L.Os therefore required a relook. In this background, the Learning Outcomes(L.Os) or Lakshyas on various parameters for NIPUN Grades have been redefined (as enclosed), by NCERT in alignment with the National Education Policy(NEP), 2020, NCF-FS and NIPUN Guidelines. These are on the parameters of oral language, Reading, Writing and Numeracy.

3. The redefined L.Os provide clarity on the outcomes to be achieved and can be measured for targeted inputs and evaluation. These L.Os have been defined for one year Balvatika, (age 5 to 6), Grade 1 (age 6 to 7) and Grade 2 (age 7 to 8). These need to be promptly facilitated for incorporation and usage by all the stakeholders from the ongoing academic session.

3. You are requested to ensure the following in your school and related institutions:

- Display the Posters on NIPUN Bharat Lakshyas(redefined) from Balvarika 3 (age 5 to 6) to Grade 2 (age 7 to 8) in regional/local language
- Display the NIPUN Bharat Pledge in regional/local language
- Make available atleast one hard copy of the Developmental Goal-wise Key competencies and Learning outcomes in each classroom under foundational stage and train teachers accordingly.

4. Your kind cooperation for effective and timely implementation of NIPUN Bharat Mission would be highly appreciated to ensure universal acquisition of foundational literacy and numeracy, so that every child achieves the desired learning competencies in reading, writing and numeracy at the end of Grade 2, by 2026-27.

As you are aware that as per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, one of the highest priority for the school education system is accorded to achieve universal acquisition of Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) skills at primary level by 2026. Foundational Learning is the basis of all future learning for a child. Not achieving basic Foundational skills of being able to read with comprehension, writing and doing basic mathematics operations, leaves the child unprepared for the complexities in the curriculum in higher classes. The NEP has provided a structure of 5+3+3+4 for the school education continuum out of which the first 5 is 3 years of preschool education and grade 1 and 2. The next 3 is Grade 3, 4, 5 and so on.

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3. As a follow-up of the NEP 2020, National Curriculum Framework for Foundational Stage (NCF-FS) for 3-8 years age group of children has been brought out under the guidance of National Steering Committee for NCFs. The NCF for Foundational Stage was released by Hon'ble Education Minister on 20th Oct 2022 at New Delhi. The NCF-FS is the first ever integrated Curriculum Framework for children between ages 3-8 in India - a direct outcome of the 5+3+3+4 'curricular and pedagogical' structure. The Learning Teaching Material - a play, toy and experiential learning based pedagogy - for pre-school education, aptly named, "Jaadui Pitara (जादुई पिटारा)" was launched on 20th Feb, 2023 and in due course the books corresponding to NCF-FS upto Grade 2 have been released.

4. It has been observed that NIPUN Bharat Mission is not completely aligned with NEP 2020 and NCF-FS. As mentioned earlier, the NEP 2020 clearly gives a framework of 5+3+3+4 where the initial 5 pertains to 3 years of preschool education and Grade 1 and 2, translating to age group of 3-8 years. The NCF-FS also covers the same 5 years in the education continuum of 15 years and accordingly text books for FS have been made for upto Grade 2. The ECCE also covers the age of 0-8 years where 0 to 3 years is homebased. Only the NIPUN-Bharat Mission talks of including Grade 3 for FLN covering 3 to 9 year olds.

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

Detailed NIPUN Bharat Mission Guidelines were developed and released at the time of launch of the mission. These include the Lakshya or Targets for Foundational Literacy and Numeracy starting from the Balvatika upto Grade 3. In addition, other learning outcomes on developmental goals have been developed and codified covering various aspects, concepts and skills.


