VIDYANJALI

Vidyanjali is an initiative of Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, for facilitating the community and volunteers to directly connect with the government and government-aided schools to contribute their services and/or assets/ materials/equipments through a dedicated portal.

It's an online portal to facilitate volunteer contribution by alumni of educational institutions, serving and retired teachers, scientists, government/semi-government officials, retired armed forces personnel, self-employed and salaried professionals, homemakers, persons from Indian diaspora and any other organization/group or company in the government/government aided schools of their choice pan-India by registering on the Vidyanjali portal. The interested volunteers can contribute either in the form of assets or material or can participate by sharing their knowledge and skills in curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

The broad categories for volunteer contribution cover services/activities as well as assets/materials such as basic civil infrastructure, basic electrical infrastructure, digital infrastructure, equipment for extra-curricular activities & sports, yoga, health and safety aids, teaching learning materials, maintenance & repairs, office stationery/furniture/support services/needs etc

By reaping the benefits of Vidyanjali portal our school also conducted different activities with the collaboration of different organisations. Below are the gist of activities conducted under Vidyanjali initiative:

Seminar on 'Drug De-addiction awareness'

Drug addiction has become a common phenomenon in nowadays. Hence a special session on drug de-addiction was conducted in December 2023 with the collaboration of Bharmakumaris. In this session students were familiarize with the adverse effects of drugs. They were also motivated to know themselves and choose a right path in their life

Awareness Seminar on Child Developmental Disabilities

On 27 March 2024, a seminar on "Child Developmental Disabilities" was conducted with the 'Nurture Foundation'. A fabulous session on the identification & dealing with the child having disabilities at the earliest stage was discussed with the parents of 3-4th class students. This session enlighten parents about the identification of children with special needs and ways to deal with it. Main agenda of the session were:

- To highlight the difficulties involved in diagnosis
- Look at the possible signs and symptoms.
- To recognize challenging behaviors
- To Identify possible risks.
- Suggest support strategies

This programme marked a great success where more than 50 parents joined the seminar.
