Overview of Activities Conducted in The Vidyalaya Since the VMC Meeting on August 22, 2024

1. Olympiad Preparation

In the month of October, significant efforts were made by all the concerned teachers to prepare students for the Olympiad (SOF) across various subjects. A total of 354 students participated, with meticulous preparation ensuring that the exams were conducted in a secure and organized manner. This initiative aimed to foster a spirit of competition among students and enhance their readiness for various competitive examinations.

2. TARA App Registration

In September, 100% of students from classes 6 to 8 were registered on the TARA App. This platform assesses students' oral reading fluency in both Hindi and English, allowing for recordings to be uploaded. The purpose is to evaluate reading proficiency and provide constructive feedback for improvement.

3. Professional Development for Teachers

Following the Continuous Professional Development (CPD) guidelines, teachers participated in various courses. Notably, in September, they completed the Project Inclusion Course. Additionally, workshops on NEP 2020, NCF-SE, Child Sexual Abuse material (CSAM) and Hindi Language workshop and Cyber Crime were conducted in August and September, enhancing teachers' skills and knowledge.

4. Half-Yearly Examinations:

Half-yearly examinations for classes 6 to 9 and the PT-II exams for classes IX and X were successfully conducted. And after evaluation of the answer script, feedback was given to the students.
